Opening Tip

- Colorado State is back on the road to start a two-game road trip, heading to Fayetteville, Ark. to take on Arkansas, Tuesday, Dec. 5 at 6 pm MT.
- The first-ever contest between the Rams and Razorbacks will be televised on SEC Network Plus/WatchESPN.com, with Brett Dolan on the play-by-play and Kikko Haydar handling analysis.
- Live audio is available on the Colorado State Sports Network, including KARS 102.9 FM (flagship). Brian Roth is on the play-by-play for the Rams, with Adam Nigon handling the analysis.
- The game will also have live audio on CSURams.com in partnership with SIDEARM Sports and live stats on arkansasrazorbacks.com.

Rams Quick Hits

- The 2017-18 season marks the 116th in the history of the Colorado State men's basketball program. The Rams are 1,244-1,235 (.502) in 2,479 games all-time.
- Colorado State is under the direction of coaching veteran Larry Eustachy, who is starting his sixth season as the leader of the Rams' program and his 27th as a Division I head coach in 2017-18. Last season, Eustachy reached the 500-win plateau in his coaching career and the 100-victory mark at CSU along with being named the Mountain West Coach of the Year.
- Colorado State basketball is looking for its eighth invitation for postseason play in the last nine years, advancing to the second round of the 2017 National Invitation Tournament.
- CSU lost two of last year's five starters, including Mountain West Player of the Year Gian Clavell and First Team All-MW forward Emmanuel Omogbo, who set a new record for double-doubles in league play in 2016-17.
- Overall, the Rams return three players with significant starting experience in redshirt-junior J.D. Paige, junior Prentiss Nixon and redshirt-sophomore Nico Carvacho. Nixon, an honorable mention All-MW pick by the media last year, averaged 13.2 points per game, while Paige was at 8.8 points and a team-best 2.5 assists per game. Carvacho posted 5.4 points and 5.7 rebounds per game, ranking third on the team in boards.

The Coaches

- Colorado State Head Coach **Larry Eustachy** (Long Beach State, '79) is in his sixth season at the helm of the Rams and holds a 115-64 (.642) record at CSU and 517-322 (.616) overall coaching record in his 27th season. In 2016-17, CSU posted an 24-12 mark, including 13-4 in Mountain West play, advanced to the MW Championship game and played in the second round of the National Invitation Tournament.
- Arkansas Head Coach **Mike Anderson** (Tulsa, '82) is in his seventh season as leader of the Razorbacks with a 133-76 record and 16th season as a head coach overall, with a 333-174 record.

Scouting Arkansas

- The Razorbacks are 5-2 after suffering a 91-65 road loss at Houston, Dec. 2.
- Picked to finish sixth in the Southeastern Conference, Arkansas returns two starters and nine letterwinners from last year's team that tied for third in the league and played in last year's NCAA Tournament.
- This season, the the two returning starters are leading the Razorbacks. Senior guard Jayle Barford, who was a preseason All-SEC second team, lead the squad in scoring at 19.7 points per game, while senior guard Daryl Macon, also a preseason second-team pick, is right behind at 15.4 points per game, connecting on 48.6 percent from beyond the three-point arc.

A Win Over Arkansas Will...

- Give the Rams its first win away from home this season.
- Improve CSU to 11-6 against the SEC (3-4 on the road).
- Move Larry Eustachy within five wins of Stew Morrill for second on the CSU career coaching chart.

First Time Against the Razorbacks

- The Rams and Razorbacks are meeting for the first time on the hardwood floor.
- The home-and-home men's basketball series will begin this season in Fayetteville and conclude in 2018-19 in Fort Collins, with the latter game date yet to be determined.
- Head Coach Larry Eustachy is 1-1 all-time against Arkansas (0-1 in Fayetteville). His two previous meetings came when he was at Iowa State (W, 77-71 at Big Island Invitational on 11/27/99) and at Southern Miss (L, 35-77 in Fayetteville on 11/30/05).

History with the SEC

- Colorado State has played teams currently in the SEC just 16 times, holding a 10-6 record, but just 2-4 on the road.
- Head Coach Larry Eustachy is just 17-16 all-time against current SEC teams, including 3-12 on road courts.

Eustachy Among the Elite

- CSU head coach Larry Eustachy has ranked among the best coaches in his sport for nearly two and a half decades. Now in his 27th season as a mentor at the NCAA Division I level, he got his 500th career win against Air Force in conference play last year.
- His 517 wins ranks 15th among active NCAA Division I coaches (same standard) and is tied for No. 55 all-time

- In his first season as the top man of the Rams' program, Eustachy became the only head coach in NCAA Division I history to lead five different programs - CSU, Southern Miss, Iowa State, Utah State and Idaho - to 24 or more wins in a season.
- With a career record of 517-322 (.616), Eustachy ranks as one of just 75 head coaches (out of 351 Division I programs) to have a .600 or better win percentage with a minimum of five years experience. He is one of just 32 coaches in the ranking with at least 20 years of Division I experience.

Moving Up the CSU Coaching Ranks

- CSU head coach Larry Eustachy continues to move up the record chart for the Rams in victories.
- Already starting the season with the highest winning percentage among coaches with at least four years at the school, Eustachy reached the 100-win plateau at CSU faster than any other coach in school history and passed Dale Layer (103, 2001-07) for third during the 2016-17 campaign.
- Three of his teams have the three-highest single-season win totals in program history with 27 (2014-15), 26 (2012-13) and adding 24 victories last season.

Long Road Trip Completed

- The Rams came off a three-game, eight day road trip from Nov. 15-22 that not only took days but numerous miles of travel:
- First Leg (Fort Collins to Montego Bay) - 70 miles on the road, 2,313 miles in the air
- Second Leg (Montego Bay to Las Cruces) - 2,028 miles in the air, 52 miles on the road
- Final Leg (Las Cruces to Fort Collins) - 574 miles in the air
- Total Travel Miles: 5,037**

Last Time Out...

- For the first time in the last five meetings, the home team got the victory in the hoops version of the Rocky Mountain Showdown as Colorado State picked up its second straight win over Colorado, 72-63, Dec. 2.
- Leading 38-35 at the halftime break, the home Rams gave up the first bucket of the half but then went on a 9-2 run to build the lead to 47-39 five minutes into the final period. Colorado State continued to build on that advantage over the next seven-plus minutes, capped by redshirt-sophomore guard Anthony Bonner's three, to go up 63-46 with 7:40 remaining. CU would not go away, cutting it down to just a four-point margin in the final minute, but the Rams connected on five of six free-throw attempts in that span to seal the win.
- The opening 20 minutes of the game was a battle, as the game was tied five times and the lead changed hands nine times. CSU built as much as a seven-point lead but CU chipped back into it and took a 33-32 lead with 1:38 to play in the half. A conventional three-point play by redshirt-sophomore Lorenzo Jenkins put the Rams up two. The Buffs tied it on a pair of Tyler Bey free throws, but junior guard Prentiss Nixon canned a deep triple with just a few ticks on the clock to put the Rams up 38-35 at the intermission, a lead they would never relinquish.
- For the game, Colorado State shot 40.7 percent (22-of-54) from the floor, including 38.9 percent (7-of-18) from the three-point line. Colorado was 39.3 percent (24-of-61) on field goal attempts and just 32.0 percent (8-of-25) on threes. One difference was the charity stripe, as the Rams were 21-of-29 (72.4 percent), with the Buffs going to the line just 13 times, hitting seven (53.8 percent).
- The Rams were led by Nixon and redshirt-junior J.D. Paige with 16 points each, with Nixon hitting four threes and Paige going 5-of-5 at the free throw line. Senior Che Bob chipped in 11 points, six rebounds and three blocks, while junior Deion James added eight points, 10 rebounds, three assists and three steals. Redshirt-sophomore Nico Carvacho also had eight points, nine rebounds and a career-high four blocked shots. The Buffs had two players

in double figures, as McKinley Wright had a game-high 19 points and Dominique Collier tallied 10.

Moby Arena Homecourt Advantage

- CSU has a record of 542-217 (.714) record all-time at Moby Arena.
- The Rams are 76-19 (.800) under Larry Eustachy in games played at Moby Arena.
- CSU completed the 2016-17 regular-season home slate at 14-5 (7-2 in Mountain West), giving the program a winning home record for the eighth straight season, including all five under head coach Larry Eustachy.
- Colorado State finished the 2015-16 regular season 12-5 at Moby Arena.
- At 15-5 in 2016-17 at Moby Arena, it marked the fifth time in program history that CSU won at least 15 home games. Last season's 15 victories was the sixth season of 15-plus wins at the Rams' arena.
- The Rams finished the 2014-15 regular-season one win shy (15-2) of the best home mark in program history (16-1 in 2012-13). CSU went 15-2 at Moby in 1987-88.

Roster Size... But Inexperienced

- CSU has 11 players available for action during the 2017-18 season. Of those, eight were part of the program last season, with six having played, with two newcomers to the lineup.
- Senior Che Bob and juniors J.D. Paige and Prentiss Nixon will be looked at to lead the squad. Redshirt-sophomores Nico Carvacho and Anthony Bonner also saw extensive action last year. Redshirt-sophomore Juan Sabino II came in at midseason and played limited minutes in 2016-17.
- Redshirt-junior Robbie Berwick and redshirt-sophomore Lorenzo Jenkins will see their first playing time at Colorado State. Transfers junior Deion James and redshirt-sophomore Raquan Mitchell as well as freshman Logan Ryan join the program and are expected to contribute.
- However, the Rams combine for just 7.5 seasons of NCAA Division I experience, four of those coming from juniors J.D. Paige and Prentiss Nixon.

Newcomers

- Robbie Berwick and Lorenzo Jenkins saw their first action for the Rams against Sacramento State after sitting out last year due to NCAA D-I transfer rules. Transfers Raquan Mitchell and Deion James also saw their first playing time at Colorado State against the Hornets, while true freshman Logan Ryan got his first collegiate playing time in the home win over Winthrop.

It's TV Time For the Rams

- All but one of Colorado State's home conference games will be available via network broadcasts, with 15 of 18 MW handled by major partners. Of the 21 games during the entire season being available on television channels this year, 10 are on CBS Sports Network, four on AT&T SportsNet (formerly ROOT Sports), six on the ESPN family of networks and one on the Pac-12 Network.
- Both games of the Jamaica Classic played in Montego Bay will be on CBS Sports Network, as CSU takes on Tulane (Nov. 17) and Florida State (Nov. 19).
- The Rams will first make a home national TV appearance on Saturday, Dec. 2, as the in-state rivalry game with Colo-



rado will be televised on AT&T SportsNet at 11 a.m., the first part of a two-game doubleheader with the CSU women's team hosting BYU at 2 p.m.

- CSU starts conference action on the road at Boise State Dec. 27, with the game televised on CBS Sports Network at 7:30 p.m. MT.
- The selection of games by the Mountain West's television partners shifted two of the Rams' league games to Tuesday nights, including San Diego State (CBS Sports Network on Jan. 2) and at Air Force (AT&T Sportsnet on Feb. 6). Additionally, the game at New Mexico on Jan. 27 is an ESPN Netflix game, where the game will be televised on ESPN or ESPN3.

Road Improvements

- Last season, CSU picked up its fifth straight MW road win and sixth in conference play at New Mexico, Feb. 21, a streak snapped at Nevada March 4, but the Rams finished 9-6 in games away from home in 2016-17.
- The Rams won five straight MW road games for the first time ever under head coach Larry Eustachy and for the second time in school history.
- The only other time CSU won five consecutive conference road games occurred over the last four games of the 1988-89 and first game of the 1989-90 season in the WAC.
- Under Eustachy, CSU is 26-36 (.419) in true road games, above the national average of 32.4 percent.
- For comparison in 2015-16, the Rams were 6-11 in games away from Moby Arena.

Rebounding Emphasis Noted

- Head coach Larry Eustachy makes rebounding one of his top priorities in all practices and games and it shows in his record, as CSU is 98-31 under the leader when winning the glass.
- The Rams won the battle of the boards in 22 of their 36 games last season, going 19-3 in those contests.
- Colorado State was +2.6 on the glass in its 36 games with at least one player with a double-figure rebounding total in 26 of 36 games.
- Last season, CSU finished third in the Mountain West and at 38.2 rebounds per game as well as second in the MW at +2.7 rebounding margin.
- This season, it is again a key for the Rams, as they have on the boards six times, including all four victories.

Quick Bits Under Eustachy

- The Rams had a seven-game Mountain West winning streak during last season, the longest MW win streak in program history from Feb. 4-28 (7-0 in February).
- CSU is 101-7 (40-3 MW) when leading with five minutes to play under head coach Larry Eustachy and 106-7 (45-4 MW) when leading with two minutes to go.
- The 21-point loss at Fresno State, Jan. 18, 2017 was a rarity, as it was just the second time that a Eustachy-led CSU team lost to a MW foe by more than 15 points (16-2 in his five years in MW games decided by 16 points or more).
- The Rams are 98-28 (40-14 MW) when shooting more free throws than their opponent and 101-25 (44-12 MW) when opponent commits more fouls overall.
- When Colorado State forces more turnovers than it gives up, the good guys have posted a 68-19 overall record.
- When the Rams shoot at least 45 percent from the floor, they are 65-6 (27-4 MW) in five years under Eustachy.

Nixon Does It All

- Junior Prentiss Nixon became an integral part of the CSU lineup the last two seasons.
- The guard averaged 13.2 points per game in 2016-17 (13th in MW), scoring in double figures in 27 games, including a current streak of 10 straight.
- In all MW contests, he averaged 13.3 points per game - 17th in regular-season league only.
- He scored a career-high 30 points against Kansas State and surpassed his season high from last year six times.
- In the Mountain West Tournament, Nixon averaged 14.7 points per game, earning All-Tournament honors.
- Against Nevada in the MW championship, Nixon scored 23

points, including tying the school record for a MW Tournament game with six three-pointers.

- This year, Nixon continued his double-figure scoring streak, moving it to 12 with a pair of 16-point performances before it was snapped against Tulane, Nov. 17. However, he started a new streak with 22 points, including five three-pointers, against Florida State, Nov. 19, followed by 15 at New Mexico State, Nov. 22. He missed the Northwestern State game with a concussion but returned to the lineup with 20 points at Missouri State, Nov. 28.
- Nixon leads CSU in scoring at 15.9 points per game and has hit a team-best 20 three-pointers.
- He also continues to do the job on the defensive end, as he has drawn 15 offensive fouls in his first seven games along with grabbing 12 steals. Last year, he finished with 37 drawn fouls.

Bob Learning the Ropes

- Junior Che (said CHAY not SHAY) Bob is figuring out ways to contribute to the Rams' effort in all phases.
- Getting the start in seven of seven games played this year, Bob is averaging 12.6 points per game (2nd for CSU) and a team-high 9.3 rebounds per contest (3rd in the Mountain West).
- Bob had a streak of four straight games with a double-double (five total in his CSU career), with the most recent performance of 13 points and 12 boards at Missouri State, Nov. 28.
- He tied a career high with 21 points at New Mexico State, Nov. 24, including connecting on seven free throws and a pair of three pointers.
- In the win over Colorado Dec. 2, Bob scored 11 points, grabbed six rebounds and blocked three shots.

Paige Wheels & Deals

- Redshirt-Junior J.D. (or as Coach Eustachy calls him Jeremiah) Paige adjusted well to his new role within CSU's offense last year.
- Paige led CSU assists (2.5 apg), was third in steals (0.9 spg) and blocked shots (0.7) and fourth in scoring (8.8 ppg).
- The Denver, Colo., native had a solid outing against Alcorn State (11/23), recording career bests of 23 points and six assists in the home victory.
- Paige tied his career high with 23 points, including a career-best five three-pointers in the win over Fresno State, Feb. 11, 2017.
- This season, Paige picked up a season-high 19 points versus Northwestern State (11/24).
- He tied for team-high honors with 16 points and earned a career-best seven boards in the win over Colorado, Dec. 2.
- With his recent performances, Paige is now averaging an improved 11.4 points per game, third on the team.

Colorado State Policy on Injury Reports

Due to circumstances surrounding the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) and the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA), Colorado State University has developed a policy regarding the release of injury information.

CSU student-athletes have the right to hold all injury information, except body part and playing status, confidential and private. As a standard operating procedure, coaches, athletic communications staff, and other athletic department personnel should refrain from sharing specific injury information with the media. However, in certain occasions, injury information could be released at the discretion of the athletic communications department after authorization is obtained from the student-athlete.

It is the policy of the CSU athletic training staff to not address the media unless it is absolutely necessary. Therefore, inquiries by the media regarding medical situations should be addressed to the Athletic Communications office.

GAME 9 - AT ARKANSAS

Guards Stepping Up Scoring

- Redshirt-junior J.D. Paige and junior Prentiss Nixon both showed what another year of college basketball can do for confidence and skills.
- In 2015-16, Paige averaged 4.9 points a game and shot just 33.8 percent from the field, while Nixon was 4.8 points and 38.9 percent from the floor.
- Last season, the duo has increased their scoring averages by more than double combined, as Nixon finished at 13.2 points per game while Paige posted 8.8 points per contest.
- So far in 2017-18, Nixon is leading the team at 15.9 points per game and Paige is tied for third at 11.4 per contest.

Carvacho Growing On the Floor

- Redshirt-sophomore center Nico Carvacho is showing his increased comfort level on the floor for the Rams.
- Carvacho had a breakout game at Colorado, Nov. 30, 2016, scoring 14 points on 5-of-7 shooting and grabbing 9 rebounds.
- Against Northern Colorado Dec. 10, 2016, he posted his first collegiate double-double of 13 points (5-of-6 FG) and 11 boards.
- In the win over Wyoming, Feb. 28, 2017, Carvacho posted his second double-double of his collegiate career with 10 points (3-3 FG) and 10 rebounds.
- This season, Carvacho is second on the glass for CSU on the glass with 72 boards (30 offensive) in the first eight games. His 9.0 boards per game average ranks fifth in the Mountain West.
- He had his third career double-double with 11 points and a career-best 20 boards in the home win over Winthrop, Nov. 14.
- Recently, he swatted a career-best four blocked shots along with eight points and nine rebounds in the win over Colorado, Dec. 2.

Taking Charity

- For the 2016-17 season, CSU was 73.1 percent from the charity line, ranking 34th nationally in free throws made and 33rd in free throws attempted.
- The Rams also made 596 free throws while their opponents combined for just 663 total attempts.
- In the win at Colorado Nov. 30, the Rams made their first 18 free throws in a row, a key reason that CSU won the road game.
- For seven games, the Rams have shot 71.7 percent from the free throw line, better than the opponents 69.0 percent. However, CSU has gone to the line just 11 more times total than its foes, something uncommonly low in the five-plus years under head coach Larry Eustachy.

Coaches Shows Back at Lucky Joe's

- The Coors Light Basketball Coaches' Show is back again, hosted at Lucky Joe's Sidewalk Saloon in Old Town Fort Collins. The show starts at 6 pm with women's coach Ryun Williams, followed by men's coach Larry Eustachy for the second half-hour. Remaining dates of the shows are:
 - December: Monday, Dec. 11 and Wednesday, Dec. 20
 - January: Mondays, Jan. 8, 15, 22 & 29
 - February: Thursday, Feb. 8 and Mondays, Feb. 12 & 19
 - March: Thursday, March 1

Mountain West Record

- Colorado State - a charter member of the Mountain West - is now 119-159 (.428) in regular-season action against MW foes since the formation of the league in 1999-2000.
- Head coach Larry Eustachy is 52-36 (.591) in MW regular-season action in his time at Colorado State and 58-41 including tournament games.

Rams Take 2017 MW Awards

- Colorado State again was among the top honorees, this time by the coaches of the Mountain West Conference, as senior guard Gian Clavell was selected as the league's 2017 Player of the Year, while Larry Eustachy was recognized as the Coach of the Year.

- Senior forward Emmanuel Omogbo was named First Team All-MW along with Clavell, while the pair also was named to the league's All-Defensive team.
- This is the first time in school history that CSU has had two players named to the first team all-conference in any season, as well as two in a single season named to the all-defensive squad.
- The duo was also named to the U.S. Basketball Writers Association All-District team for District VIII.
- The 2017 Mountain West Player of the Year according to the league media, Clavell led the MW in league scoring at 21.2 points per game, including two games of 30 points or more, as well as ranking seventh in rebounding at 6.9 per MW game. Often guarding the opponent's top backcourt player, Clavell also was second in steals (1.8 spg) and 3-pointers made (3.1 3pg) while ranking seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.409).
- Eustachy led the Rams to a 21-10 overall regular season record, 13-5 in the Mountain West and the No. 2 seed in the MW tournament. The 13 wins tied the program record for conference wins, while CSU set a new school mark with five consecutive league road wins in a single season. This is the first time in his five years in the MW and the sixth time overall that Eustachy has been selected as his conference's coach of the year.
- Selected by the league media to First Team All-Mountain West, Omogbo became the new standard for double-doubles in the Mountain West this past season, recording a new league record with 13 during conference action. He led the conference in rebounding at 10.9 boards per conference game and ranked 11th in scoring at 15.7 points a contest. He was also third in league field goal percentage, hitting .495 of his shot attempts, and tied for eighth at 1.3 steals per game.

Rams on the Radio

- Rams basketball can be heard live worldwide on the Rams Sports Properties Colorado State Sports Network. The 2017-18 season features live game coverage of all of Colorado State's regular-season and postseason contests.
- Brian Roth, the Voice of the Rams, is in his fifth season as the basketball team's full-time play-by-play announcer. He is joined for the second season by former Ram Adam Nigon who will provide color commentary for the Rams.
- In addition to the Colorado State Sports Network, Rams fans worldwide can listen to the action live streaming on CSURams.com in partnership with SIDEARM Sports.

Looking Ahead

- Colorado State will complete its toughest four-game stretch of the year with the second road game on this trip at Oregon on Friday, Dec. 9 at 8 p.m. MT.
- The contest between the Rams and Ducks will be televised on the Pac-12 Network.
- The game will air across the Colorado State Sports Network (along with online at CSURams.com), with Brian Roth and Adam Nigon on the call.

LARRY EUSTACHY

Head Coach • Sixth Year at CSU • Long Beach State (1979)

Larry Eustachy, the 2000 Associated Press and U.S. Basketball Writers Association National Coach of the Year, enters his sixth season as head coach of the Colorado State men's basketball program in 2017-18. He was introduced as the 19th head coach in the history of the CSU basketball on April 12, 2012.

Last season, Eustachy led the Rams to a 24-12 record and 13-5 in the Mountain West, finishing second in the regular season after being picked seventh in the pre-season poll. His squad's effort earned Eustachy the Mountain West Coach of the Year honors from both the coaches and the media this season as well as NABC

District 17 and USBWA District Coach of the Year awards.

One of the most decorated active coaches in NCAA basketball, Eustachy enters his 27th season as a head coach as the only head coach in Division I history to lead five different programs - CSU, Southern Miss, Iowa State, Utah State and Idaho - to 24 or more wins in a season. With a career record of 515-318 (.619), Eustachy ranks as one of just 75 head coaches (out of 351 Division I programs) to have a .600 or better win percentage with a minimum of five years experience. He entered the season just 11 victories from the 500-win mark in his career and is 28th on the active career wins

A veteran mentor with more than 35 seasons of coaching experience - including 25 seasons as a head coach - Eustachy has amassed an impressive 512-317 record in stops at Idaho (1990-93), Utah State (1993-98), Iowa State (1998-03) and Southern Miss (2004-12) and CSU (2012-present), leading his squads to 12 campaigns of 20 or more victories, 10 postseason berths (including five NCAA tournament appearances), and six conference championships.

Eustachy, a native of Alameda, Calif., and a 1979 graduate of Long Beach State University, has garnered numerous coaching honors throughout his illustrious career. In addition to his two National Coach of the Year nods in 2000, he was also the 2001 runner-up for the AP's top coaching honor.

He was twice named the Big West and Big 12 Coach of the Year during stints at Utah State (1995 and 1998) and Iowa State (2000 and 2001), respectively, and joins the Rams after leading his Southern Miss Golden Eagles' squad to 25 wins in 2011-12 to earn the 2012 Conference USA Coach of the Year award. Eustachy was also the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) District 11 Coach of the Year in 2012.

Eustachy's coaching career began at the age of 22 as an assistant coach at Citrus (Calif.) College, where he played two seasons after a standout prep career at Arcadia High School. From 1981-90, Eustachy honed his skills as an assistant at Division I schools Mississippi State (1981-86), Idaho (1986-87), Utah (1987-89) and Ball State (1989-90) before taking his first head coaching job at Idaho (1990-93).

Following his stint at Idaho, Eustachy spent five seasons (1993-98) as the head coach at Utah State (1993-98). He then took over for close friend Tim Floyd at Iowa State, spending five seasons in Ames, Iowa, and leading the Cyclones to the Elite Eight in the 2000 NCAA tournament.

Eustachy spent the previous eight seasons at Southern Miss, where he resurrected the Golden Eagles program and led USM to four 20 win seasons, including each of his last three campaigns in Hattiesburg.

Eustachy is a native of Alameda, Calif. He and his wife Lana live in Fort Collins. Eustachy has two sons, Hayden and Evan.

list. He is also one of just 33 coaches in the ranking with at least 20 years of Division I experience.

At Colorado State, he put together the most wins in a four-year span of the program with 87, surpassing Boyd Grant's 81 victories (1988-91). He began his fifth season with the highest winning percentage among coaches with at least three years at the school at .644 and started 13 wins away from 100 and 17 wins from taking over third on the CSU coaching chart. His teams have also won more than 80 percent of their games at CSU's Moby Arena in his four years of leadership.

In his first year at the helm, Eustachy led the Rams to arguably the best season in school history, guiding the squad to a then-program-best 26-9 record, and an NCAA Tournament victory over the Missouri Tigers before bowing out against eventual national champion Louisville. The Rams also cracked the Associated Press top 25 for first time since 1954.

Eustachy continued to rewrite the Rams' record books in his third season in 2014-15, leading the Rams to a school-record 14-0 start before once again notching a program-best season record at 27-7. The Rams advanced to the postseason (NIT) for the second time in three years under his watch, and ranked for two weeks in the AP Top-25 and three weeks in the USA Today Coaches poll.

Media Credentials

- Media credentials are distributed on a season or single-game basis. Requests should be made at least one week prior to an event.
- Credentials will be left prior to the game at media will call, located at the lower (ground level) southwest entrance of Moby Arena, adjacent to the Anderson Academic & Training Center and directly across the street (to the north) from the Ram Field softball complex.

Photographer Credentials

- Photo credentials are issued only to accredited photographers. Passes must be displayed at all times.
- Photographer's boxes are located at both ends of the playing court, on the south side of each basket standard, opposite the team benches. Still and video photographers are allowed to be positioned in either of these boxes only.
- Photography is not allowed from any of the court-side media or donor seating along either baseline or the south side of the playing court, the team bench area, or official scorer's table.
- No photography equipment (i.e., cameras, strobes) shall be attached to the backboard, goal standards or tables located courtside without specific, prior written permission.
- Still photographers may not utilize flash attachments at any courtside location.
- Tripods may not be placed on or beside the playing floor, or on any table.
- Upper-level still and video photographer positions are located above the south side seating areas and in the press box overhead on the north side. Photographers are unable to use the south side location for any game that is being televised. Individuals seeking to use the north side location must be granted permission by a member of the Athletics Communications staff.

Parking

- Access to the parking lot immediately west of the McGraw Center will require an "A" permit from 7:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. weekdays
- Annual permits can be purchased through the Office of Parking Management Web site: www.colostate.edu/depts/parking.
- Event parking permits will be made available to credentialed media for home games at Moby Arena. To acquire an event parking pass, contact John Martin with the request.

Interview Guidelines

- Interviews, either in person or via telephone, with members of Colorado State's men's basketball coaching staff and studentathletes must be coordinated through assistant media relations director John Martin.
- Home and/or cell phone numbers will not be provided to the media, by the coaches, student-athletes, or the athletic department. Media are asked not to request an individual's personal contact information, including e-mail and cell number, but rather to contact John Martin.
- Student-athletes and coaches are available for interviews at the conclusion of selected practice sessions. Student-athlete interviews will not conflict with classes, meetings, medical treatment or practice times. Additionally, student-athletes who are not eligible to play in games, including transfers sitting out the season, will not be available for interviews.
- Interviews are not permitted in the locker room or training room.
- No pregame interviews will be granted on game days.
- Telephone interviews should be requested at least 24 hours in advance and coordinated through John Martin. All interviews will be processed on an availability basis involving the requested interviewee.

Postgame Guidelines

- At the conclusion of every game, Colorado State coach Larry Eustachy will use the NCAA-suggested 10-minute cooling period to address members of the team.
- At the conclusion of the NCAA-suggested cooling period, Eustachy will address the media in the Adolf Coors Family Foundation Auditorium, Room 100, in the McGraw Athletic Center.
- Colorado State's locker room is closed to the media at all times. Specific players will be brought to the press conference upon request.
- The media relations office will do its best to accommodate all properly made requests.
- Other than network contractual obligations, no student-athlete or coach can appear on a live postgame television or radio interview without permission obtained prior to the game from John Martin.

Broadcast Rights and Restrictions

- Colorado State, its opponent and the respective conference designate the broadcast rights for all games. CSU follows the guidelines established by the NCAA Championship Events Committee.
- Radio and television stations and Internet sites that have not purchased rights shall not carry any broadcast report from the arena on a live basis or any live description, footage of any game action while it is still in progress.
- No pregame and, or postgame live coverage shall be permitted for two hours before and one-half hour after the sporting event without the express permission of the university.
- Per NCAA guidelines, stations are limited to three minutes of highlights per news show. Television stations also are prohibited from selling, loaning or giving away footage to any individual or agency for use on any non-sports-news program produced or aired by the station. Games that are broadcast by television networks may have additional restrictions.
- Also, per NCAA regulations, footage and photos of athletes with eligibility remaining may NOT be used to commercially promote any product, service or media outlet and may not be sold, loaned to other individuals, agencies for this purpose. Disrespect of credential privileges will result in withdrawal of all future credentials.
