## TEAM NOTES

\#RV/RV TENNESSEE VS. ARKANSAS
\#RV/RV Tennessee (16-10, 7-6 SEC) begins a two-game home stand on Sunday, welcoming Arkansas (13-13, 2-11 SEC) to Thompson-Boling Arena for the Lady Vols' penultimate regular season contest in Knoxville.
■ UT and the Razorbacks will meet for the 32nd time, facing off at 3:02 p.m. ET in a game televised by the SEC Network.

After winning four straight, including a road win at \#4/4 South Carolina, Tennessee has dropped two straight and three of its past four games.
$\square$ The Lady Vols will try to bounce back from a 6557 setback at Alabama on Thursday night in which leading scorer Diamond DeShields suffered an injury that knocked her out of the game and warranted a trip to a Tuscaloosa hospital for precautionary reasons.
$\square$ DeShields, who was immobilized, lifted from the court on a spine board and wheeled out of the arena on a stretcher, was released Thursday night and traveled back to Knoxville with her teammates. $\square$ No updates have been provided on DeShields' status for Sunday's game.
■ Arkansas arrives in Knoxville having lost seven consecutive games, including a 69-62 setback to Florida in Fayetteville on Thursday night.

- The Razorbacks opened the year 9-0 and won 10 of their first 11 before struggling to a 3-12 mark since Dec. 18 with several close losses.
- The Big Orange women are 11-3 (4-2 SEC) playing on The Summitt this season, while the Razorbacks are 2-6 (1-5 SEC) competing away from Bud Walton Arena.
- The Lady Vols are tied for sixth in the SEC standings with LSU, while Arkansas is tied for 13th with Vanderbilt.

## HOME SWEET HOME

This is the 30th season that the Tennessee women's and men's basketball teams have called Thompson-Boling Arena home, and the Lady Vols own an incredible 426-35 mark (.924) in the venue. » Tennessee players have recorded
18 complete-game efforts this season, including a team-leading eight 40-minute timesheets by junior forward Jaime Nared.

All-time, the Lady Vols have a 579-59 (.908) home record in contests played at ThompsonBoling Arena, Stokely Athletics Center and Alumni Gym.
$\square$ UT is 11-3 at home in 2016-17.
Capacity at Thompson-Boling Arena is 21,678 .
$\square$ UT has led the nation in attendance 19 times in the past 25 years, finishing second the past two years after an 11-season run at No. 1.

- Tennessee ranks second in the nation in home attendance this season with an average of 9,026 through 14 dates.

TENNESSEE IN SEC PLAY
UT is 374-64 in SEC regular-season games, winning 18 championships through the years and capturing SEC tourney titles on 17 occasions.

During the Holly Warlick era, Tennessee is 57-20 in league games, making Warlick the topranked active SEC coach in terms of winning percentage in league play at .740.

- South Carolina's Dawn Staley is the next coach behind Warlick at . 679 (95-45), followed by UK's Matthew Mitchell at . 651 (99-53).

In only her fifth year as a head coach, Warlick already ranks fifth in total league wins among active SEC coaches and has won regular season titles in 2013 and 2015, and a tourney crown in 2014.

LADY VOLS FALL FROM BOTH POLLS
A 1-1 slate last week knocked the Lady Vols from both polls for the second time this season.

- UT, however, is receiving votes in both the AP Poll (27th) and USA Today Coaches Poll (27th) in the Feb. 13 and 14 editions.

On Feb. 6/7, UT returned to both (AP \#24/ USA Today \#25) polls in the same week for the first time since the Nov. 28 and 29 editions were released.

- After eight weeks in the receiving votes category, UT moved back into the USA Today Coaches Poll on Jan. 31, checking in at \#25. The Lady Vols were \#25 on Nov. 29 before dropping out after the loss to Baylor.
- After nine weeks outside the AP Poll, UT returned on Feb. 6 at \#24. The Lady Vols were ranked \#22 on Nov. 28 before dropping out after the Baylor loss.
$\square$ Nine weeks ties the longest period of time that a Lady Vol squad has been continuously outside the AP Poll. In her 11th season as head coach here, even Pat Summitt saw her 1984-85 squad miss polls No. 5 through 13.
- In her eighth season, Summitt's squad also spent four weeks (poll Nos. 8-11) on the outside looking in, as Warlick's squad did a year ago in polls 16-19.

SIZING UP THE LADY VOLS
Tennessee ranks \#18 in the most recent NCAA Women's Basketball Rating Percentage Index (RPI).
■ The Lady Vols stand \#2 in the latest NCAA Toughest Schedule Report behind UConn.
$\square$ With numerous key games still to be played before Selection Monday, the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship Sport Committee on Feb. 6 provided the second of three regular-season top 16 rankings in seed order.

While UT is not among the 16 teams, it has beaten \#3 South Carolina (76-74), \#6 Notre Dame (71-69) and \#8 Stanford (59-51). UT lost

to \#2 Baylor (88-66), \#4 Mississippi State (74-64) and \#11 Texas (72-67).

- The Feb. 14 edition of Charlie Creme's Bracketology has the Lady Vols playing in Raleigh, N.C..., as a No. 5 seed facing \#12 seed Quinnipiac of the MAAC in the first round of the NCAA Oklahoma City Regional.
- UT has gone from being a No. 7 seed, to a No. 6 seed, to a No. 5 seed in the past few releases by Creme.
$\square$ UT and South Carolina have played the most ranked teams of any SEC schools (7), and UT has the second most wins over ranked teams (4) and second most over top-10 teams (3) in the league.

South Carolina is 6-1 vs. AP-ranked teams, while UT is $4-3$, Kentucky is $2-3$, Missouri is $2-4$, Texas A\&M is $3-1$ and Mississippi State is $1-1$. USC is 4-1 vs. top-10 teams, while UT is 3-2.

## UT-ARKANSAS SERIES NOTES

Tennessee holds a 28-3 all-time record vs. Arkansas, dating back to Feb. 29, 1992, when UT prevailed, 105-59, in the initial meeting.
The Lady Vols are 13-1 in Knoxville, 13-2 in Fayetteville and 2-0 at neutral sites.
$\square$ Tennessee is $1-0$ in overtime and 2-0 in the postseason vs. UA, meeting for the first time in SEC Tournament play a year ago. UT prevailed, 68-51, in the second round in Jacksonville, Fla., on March 3, 2016.

- After defeating the Razorbacks, 60-51, at Bud Walton Arena on Jan. 11, 2015, the Lady Vols had won 11 in a row in Fayetteville, dating back to Dec. 29, 1996, when \#22/24 Arkansas took down Chamique Holdsclaw-led \#6/6 Tennessee, 77-75.
- That all changed on Jan. 15, 2016, however, when Arkansas erased an 11-point UT halftime lead and defeated the Lady Vols in Fayetteville, 64-59, to snap the streak.
- UT's only setback to the Razorbacks in Knoxville came at Thompson-Boling Arena on Feb. 23, 2012, when Arkansas walked away with a 72-71 overtime victory and ended an 18-game Lady Vol winning streak in the series.
- Tennessee avoided such a slip last season, avenging an earlier loss to the Razorbacks with a 75-57 triumph in Knoxville on Feb. 4, 2016.
- That victory gave Holly Warlick the 100th win of her head coaching career in year number four at Tennessee.
- Despite the series disparity, Tennessee has overcome significant deficits to claim three of its last five wins vs. UA and also fell to the Razorbacks in overtime, 72-71, in Knoxville on Feb. 23, 2012 in Pat Summitt's final campaign.
■ UT overcame a nine-point second-half gap in Fayetteville on Jan. 11, 2015, to win, 60-51; an eight-point first-half deficit to win 70-60 in Knoxville on Jan. 30, 2014; and an 11-point second-half gap on Feb. 24, 2013, in Fayetteville to win, 60-54.
$\square$ The last time the two teams faced each other as ranked squads was in 2003 when \#4-ranked Tennessee won 92-79 over \#12-ranked Arkansas in Fayetteville.
- No. 1/1 Tennessee and unranked Arkansas met in an NCAA Final Four semifinal game in Kansas City, Mo., on March 27, 1998, and the Lady Vols cruised past the Razorbacks, 86-58, en route to their perfect 39-0 season.

Tennessee has had one player from the state of Arkansas in its history. Standout Shekinna Stricklen (2008-12) hailed from Morrilton, Ark.


## MILESTONE WATCH

Mercedes Russell scored her 1,000th career point in the game vs. Alabama, tallying 17 vs. the Crimson Tide to run her career total to 1,013 .

Russell became the 43rd player to tally 1,000 points while wearing the Orange and White, and she currently stands 42nd on UT's all-time scoring list behind Taber Spani (1,053, 2009-13).
Diamond DeShields needs 71 points to hit 1,000 points at UT. She has 1,577 total combining her totals at Tennessee and North Carolina.

Schaquilla Nunn reached 1,000 career rebounds with her third board vs. LSU on Feb. 2. She finished the evening with nine. She now stands at 1,025 for her career, with 910 of those coming at Winthrop, her previous school.

Nunn reached 1,000 career points (including 982 at Winthrop) earlier this season. She stands at 1,107 through the A\&M game.
Russell has 717 career rebounds and needs 83 to move into UT's list of players with 800 or more rebounds. There are 17 who've made the cut.

## PLAYING AS AN UNRANKED TEAM

The Lady Vols are 16-8 while playing as an unranked team over portions of the last two years, defeating ranked foes \#16 Texas A\&M, \#9 Ohio State and \#11 Arizona State last season and \#5 South Carolina, \#6 Notre Dame, \#10 Stanford and \#17 Kentucky this year.

Tennessee is 10-5 this season while unranked in both polls.

Until topping South Carolina this season, UT last beat a top-five foe while unranked (AP) on Jan. 25, 1985, as the Lady Vols took down No. 1 Old Dominion, 67-64, in Norfolk, Va.

ABOUT THE RAZORBACKS
Arkansas returned three starters and nine letterwinners from a squad that was 12-18 a year ago with a 10th-place finish of 7-9 in the Southeastern Conference.
■ The Razorbacks were picked to finish 10th by the coaches and 11th by the media in the 2016 SEC Preseason Polls.

Jimmy Dykes is in his third season at the helm, holding a 43-45 record in his first-ever collegiate head coaching job.

- UA is led in scoring and rebounding by preseason All-SEC First Team selection Jessica Jackson, a 6-foot-3 forward.
- Jackson is averaging 14.9 points and 6.2 re-
bounds per game and leads the team in threepointers made with 39 in 116 attempts.

Guards Malica Monk and Jailyn Mason lead the team in steals (53) and assists (83) this season.

THE LAST TIME THESE TEAMS MET
Diamond DeShields scored 15 points to lead Tennessee to a 68-51 win over Arkansas on March 3, 2016, at Veterans Memorial Arena in the second round of the SEC Tournament in Jacksonville, Fla.

Tennessee (18-12, 8-8 SEC) never trailed and led by double figures for most of the game. Arkansas (12-18, 7-9 SEC) could not overcome a slow start or poor shooting (31.3 percent).

DeShields scored 10 of her 15 points in the third quarter and collected six rebounds. Jordan Reynolds had a strong all-around game, scoring 10 points and recording team highs of eight rebounds and four assists. Jaime Nared added 11 points with three assists and three boards.

The Lady Vols combined for 17 assists and enjoyed a 43-41 rebounding advantage. UT hauled down 26 offensive boards and scored 13 secondchance points. The Tennessee bench contributed 21 points in the win, including nine from Te'a Cooper.

Arkansas' Devin Cosper scored a game-high 20 points on 8 -of-19 shooting. Tennessee contained Razorbacks star forward Jessica Jackson, holding her to 12 points on 5 -of- 18 shooting. Melissa Wolf collected a game-high 12 rebounds.

## THE LAST TIME THEY MET IN KNOXVILLE

Mercedes Russell posted her ninth doubledouble of the season and Holly Warlick earned her 100th win as head coach of the Lady Vols, as Tennessee defeated Arkansas on Feb. 4, 2016, in Thompson-Boling Arena.

- Warlick became just the 17th NCAA Div. I head coach to win 100 games in her first four seasons.

■ The Lady Vols (14-8, 5-4) were led by a balanced scoring attack. Russell scored 15 points and hauled in 11 rebounds, along with a teamhigh three blocks. Diamond DeShields finished with 15 points, Te'a Cooper scored 13, and Andraya Carter added 10.

- The Lady Vols stretched their lead to 18 points early in the third quarter, but the Razorbacks fought back and cut the lead to 51-46. Tennessee answered with a 9-0 run of its own, and Arkansas was unable to mount a comeback.
■ Jessica Jackson led Arkansas (9-14, 4-6) with 18 points, including 11 in the second half. Devin Cosper added 17 points as well.


## RAZORBACKS FALL TO KENTUCKY

University of Arkansas senior Jessica Jackson scored 24 points, and the Razorbacks nearly
erased two double-digit deficits, but they were unable to complete the comeback while falling to Kentucky, 69-62, in Bud Walton Arena on Thursday night.

Jackson led all scorers with 24 points on 10-of-20 shooting for her team-leading 20th dou-ble-digit scoring game and sixth 20 -point game this season. Jailyn Mason joined her in double figures with 11 points, and Bailey Zimmerman added nine points, all from three-point range.

Taylor Murray led four players in double figures for Kentucky (18-8, 9-4 SEC) with 16 points, to go along with eight rebounds, six steals and five assists. She was joined in double figures by Makayla Epps (14 points), Maci Morris (13 points) and Evelyn Akhator, who finished with a doubledouble of 12 points and 11 rebounds.
The Razorbacks shot $45 \%$ in the game going 27 -for- 60 . It is the ninth time this season Arkansas shot $45 \%$ or better. That mark included a

7-for-13 performance from long distance. Arkansas out-rebounded Kentucky, 35-32, and had seven steals in the game.

## LADY VOLS TUMBLE IN TUSCALOOSA

Schaquilla Nunn recorded her first doubledouble of the season, but it wasn't enough as Tennessee fell short against Alabama, 65-57, at Coleman Coliseum on Thursday night.

- Nunn finished with 15 points and 15 rebounds to lead the Lady Vols (16-10, 7-6 SEC). Mercedes Russell and Alexa Middleton also cracked doubledigit scoring, with 17 and 14, respectively.
- Coco Knight led the Crimson Tide (16-10, 4-9 SEC) with 18 points and eight rebounds. Hannah Cook finished with 16 points and nine rebounds in the contest.
- The Lady Vols' offense took a blow early in the game. Diamond DeShields, UT's leading scorer, went down with an injury in the middle of the first period and was out for the remainder of the game. Jaime Nared got in early foul trouble and had to sit the majority of the first half.

Russell started a 5-0 run with a basket early in the second stanza, pulling the Lady Vols within one. The bucket gave Russell her 1,000th career point. Alabama used a late run, though, to take a 30-26 lead into halftime.

UT fought back to take a 43-42 lead late in the third behind an 11-4 run, but a last-second jumper by the Crimson Tide gave them the lead going into the final period. The momentum carried over to the fourth quarter, where the Lady Vols struggled to get anything going on offense.

After hosting the Razorbacks on Sunday, Tennessee closes its regular-season home slate with Senior Night in Knoxville vs. Florida on Feb. 23 (7 p.m., SEC Network).

- The Lady Vols wrap up the regular season at Mississippi State on Feb. 26. Tip has been set for 4 p.m. CT (5 ET) on ESPN2.
- Arkansas, meanwhile, makes a return trip to the Volunteer State on Thursday night, facing Vanderbilt in Music City at 7 p.m. CT.


## LADY VOLS LAND NATION'S NO. 1 RECRUITING CLASS FOR 2017

- Holly Warlick and her staff assembled the nation's top recruiting class, per espnW HoopGurlz and ProspectsNation.com.
$\square$ The 2017 class is the highest ranked of the Warlick era and the best overall group since UT signed the No. 3, 4, 8, 15, 20 and 33 players in the 2008 class to rank No. 1 that season.

All four players were named McDonald's AllAmericans.

The Lady Vols have added three five-star players in 6-0 guard Evina Westbrook, 5-7 point guard Anastasia Hayes and $6-2$ wing Rennia Davis, as well as a four-star post in 6-4 Kasi Kushkituah. They signed on Nov. 10, Nov. 14, Nov. 9 and Nov. 16, respectively.

## TRIO OF JUNIORS LEADING THE WAY

UT has been paced by its "Big Three" junior trio of 6-foot-6 center Mercedes Russell, 6-1 guard Diamond DeShields and 6-2 forward Jaime Nared.
■ Those three players are the team's top scorers and rebounders through 26 games, and they have combined for 25 double-doubles and 67 doublefigure scoring games (including $2020+$ efforts).

- All three have scored in double figures in 17 of 26 games thus far, including 11 of the past 14.


## HIGHEST SCORING TRIO IN THE NATION

Tennessee is the only Power 5 school with three players averaging 15 or more points per game this season, with Diamond DeShields ranking 72nd (17.3), Mercedes Russell standing 76th (16.7) and Jaime Nared at 178th (15.1).

■ Of all the schools in NCAA Division I women's basketball, only Tennessee and Northern Illinois have three players averaging 15 or more points per contest.
■ UT's "Big Three" have combined to score 1,242 of UT's 1,937 points this season, good for 64.1\%.

■ That breaks down to 47.8 ppg . for the trio, with the rest of the team supplying 26.7 ppg . to equal 74.5 total.

- In SEC play that number rises to $71.8 \%$, with the Big Three tallying 666 of UT's 928 points (51.2 of 71.4 ppg.).
- DeShields, Russell and Nared have pulled down 53.2\% of Tennessee's rebounds (572/1,075) in all games and 58.6\% (283/483) in SEC play.

MORE ON THE "BIG THREE"

- A preseason All-SEC First Team selection, Diamond DeShields is a do-it-all player who is
averaging a team-leading 17.3 points per game to rank third among SEC players. She also leads the team in steals (1.4) and ranks second on the UT squad in assists (3.5) and blocks (1.1) and third in rebounds (6.5). She is shooting $43 \%$ from the field, $34 \%$ on threes and $79 \%$ from the charity stripe.

DeShields is having a season similar to her rookie year, in which she was named national freshman of the year (USBWA, espnW, Full Court), AP Honorable Mention All-American and first team All-ACC.

- In SEC games, DeShields is second among league players at 18.6 per contest to go along with 6.7 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 1.7 steals

DeShields has scored 15 or more points in 17 of her past 22 games and has recorded four doubledoubles to surpass her total of two a year ago.
$\square$ She has scored 20 or more points on nine occasions this year (including eight of her last 14games) and 33 times in her career
$\square$ With 34 points vs. Georgia, DeShields marked her fifth career game at 30+, including three as a Lady Vol and two while at UNC.

DeShields is the daughter of retired Major League Baseball standout Delino DeShields and brother of current Texas Rangers outfielder Delino DeShields Jr.

A preseason All-SEC Second Team pick, Mercedes Russell is having a breakout season.
$\square$ Her stats include 16.7 ppg . and 9.4 rpg . while hitting $57 \%$ on field goals and $69 \%$ on free throw tries.

She is averaging 17.3 ppg . and 9.8 rpg . in league play, while hitting 58 percent from the field and 73 percent of charity tosses.
$\square$ Russell has notched double-doubles in 14 of her first 26 games this season to give her 25 for
her career. The 14 this season tie her with Candace Parker for the third-best total ever by a UT junior.

BIG THREE EYEING MARK OF THREE MEEKS
Only one time in Tennessee women's basketball history has there been a season end with three Lady Vols averaging 15.0 points per game.

- The 1997-98 campaign featured the "Three Meeks," including junior Chamique Holdsclaw (23.5) and freshmen Tamika Catchings (18.2) and Semeka Randall (15.9), accomplishing that feat.
$\square$ This season, the junior trio of Diamond DeShields (17.3) Mercedes Russell (16.7) and Jaime Nared (15.1) are trying to become the second group to hit that mark.

BEATING THREE TOP-10 TEAMS THIS YEAR
On Dec. 18, Tennessee picked up its first win over a top-10 team this season, taking down \#10/10 Stanford, 59-51, in Knoxville.
■ UT followed suit on Jan. 16, upsetting \#6/6 Notre Dame, 71-69, in Knoxville.

- Tennessee came from 15-down in the second quarter (14-down in the third) vs. the Irish to record their biggest comeback since bouncing back from 17-down to overtake Gonzaga in the NCAA Sweet 16 on March 28, 2015.
- The Lady Vols also came from 11 down to beat Stanford, previously Tennessee's biggest comeback victory since the Gonzaga game.
■UT added its third top-10 win, taking down \#5/4 South Carolina, 76-74, on Jan. 30, in Columbia after trailing by nine in the first period.
$\square$ The three top-10 wins is second most during the Holly Warlick era behind five in 2014-15.
■UT had wins over two top-10 teams a year ago, including vs. \#9/9 Ohio State (78-62) on March 25 in the NCAA Sweet 16 and at \#7/7 Oregon State (53-50) on Dec. 19. The win over Ohio State also was when UT was unranked.
- The Stanford win was UT's first victory over a top-10 team at home since taking down \#10/10 Kentucky (73-72) on Feb. 15, 2015.
$\square$ Notre Dame was the highest ranked opponent UT has beaten since toppling \#4/5 South Carolina in Knoxville on March 2, 2014.
■ The win this season over \#5/4 South Carolina was the first over a top-five team on the road since \#4/4 UT won at \#5/5 UConn, 70-64, on Jan. 6, 2007.


## ONE OF FOUR TO BEAT THREE TOP-10 TEAMS Tennessee is one of only four teams who have beaten three or more top-10 teams this season.

$\square$ The others are South Carolina (4), UConn (4) and NC State (3).

- South Carolina, who UT beat in Columbia, has four top-10 wins, including \#7 Ohio State, \#4 Louisville, \#9 UCLA and \#4 Mississippi State.

UConn has beaten four who were ranked in the top-10 at the time, including \#2 Baylor, \#2 Notre Dame, \#4 Maryland and \#6 South Carolina.

- North Carolina State has beaten \#2 Notre Dame, \#6 Florida State and \#9 Louisville.

LADY VOLS GOING THE DISTANCE AND MORE $\square$ Tennessee has had four players combine to log 18 full-game efforts this season.
D Diamond DeShields, Jaime Nared and Jordan Reynolds played the entire game vs. Stanford.

- It marked the first time in Lady Vol history three players logged complete-game duty in the same contest.

Jaime Nared has eight complete games this year (Penn State, Stanford, Vandy1, Ole Miss, Florida, South Carolina, LSU, Missouri), including four of the past six. She went 39 in two other games (Auburn, Texas A\&M).

- Diamond DeShields (Stanford, Miss. St., Ole Miss, Auburn, South Carolina) has five complete games and logged 47 in double OT vs. Georgia.

Jordan Reynolds (Stanford, Notre Dame, Georgia, Missouri) has four, going all 50 minutes in the double OT loss at Georgia.

## OPTIONS FROM LONG-RANGE

UT has four players (Alexa Middleton-34/ Jaime Nared-28/Diamond DeShields-24/Meme Jackson-23) with at least 20 3-point field goals.

This is the first Holly Warlick team with four players carding 20 or more 3 s in a season, marking the first time since 2011-12 that four have done so.

UT has not had two players make 30 or more three-pointers since 2013-14 (Simmons-72, Massengale-31), three since 2012-13 (Simmons-69, Spani-48), Massengale-34) and four since 201011 (Bjorklund-73, Simmons-63, Stricklen-42, Spani-35).
■ The Lady Vols hit 7-of-14 threes in their win over Florida on Jan. 26.

- That total was their fourth best of the season and most since hitting 11 vs. Troy on Dec. 21.
- The percentage (.500) was the third best of the year and best since hitting 50 percent (6-12) vs. Appalachian State on Dec. 14.
$\square$ UT outshot Missouri from the three-point arc for the third straight season, knocking down nine of 17 vs. 2-of-13 shooting by the Tigers. Nine ranks fourth this season, while the percentage was the best since UT hit . 857 (12-of-14) vs. Navy on Nov. 13.

SCORING IS LOOKING UP
UT averaged a program-low 65.6 a year ago, and this year's tally of 74.5 is just under nine points better.

Tennessee has scored 80 or more points in nine of 26 games this season, surpassing the team's total of four 80-point games last season.

The Lady Vols opened with 81 vs. James Madison and added 80+ games vs. Navy (85), East Tennessee State (83), Tennessee State (86), Appalachian State (92), Troy (110), UNCW (90), Vanderbilt2 (91) and Florida (84).

Tennessee's 81 points vs. JMU in the opener were the most scored by a Lady Vol team in the first road game of a season since 2007 ( $82-70$ vs. UCLA on Dec. 19).

- The 110 points scored vs. Troy on Dec. 21 were the most since UT tallied 111 vs . St. Francis on Dec. 3, 2014

The 91 points vs. Vanderbilt on Jan. 22 were the most by Tennessee in an SEC game since the Lady Vols tallied 93 vs. Auburn on Feb. 20, 2014, and the first half total of 56 vs . VU was the most since UT hit 58 vs. Alabama on Jan. 6, 2011.

## LADY VOLS SCORING 20+ POINTS

Eight different Lady Vols on the 2016-17 roster have scored 20 points or more in a game during their careers, including five this season.
$\square$ UT has 24 total 20-point-plus scoring games this season, with Diamond DeShields leading the way with nine, Mercedes Russell with six, Jaime Nared with five, followed by Alexa Middleton (3) and Meme Jackson (1).

- Current roster members have combined for 64 20-point-plus games, with Diamond DeShields tallying 33 during her career.

LADY VOL 30-POINT GAMES
Diamond DeShields has recorded five 30+ point games during her career (including three as a Lady Vol), producing a 34-point showing at Georgia on Feb. 5. It was the second-highest scoring output of her career.

The 34 points by DeShields were the most scored by a Lady Vol since Candace Parker put up 34 in the NCAA Sweet 16 vs. Notre Dame on March 30, 2008.

The total was the seventh-highest Lady Vol scoring total in a road game.

DeShields' highest-scoring career game was a 38-point outburst vs. N.C. State on Feb. 16, 2014, when DeShields was a freshman playing at North Carolina.

- Schaquilla Nunn recorded two 30+ scoring efforts while at Winthrop, including a high of 39 vs. Gallaudet in the opener of the 2014-15 season.
$\square$ DeShields had two 30+ games last season, which put her on Tennessee's all-time single-season list. That list follows.

An additional 30+ point effort this season would put DeShields on the list for the second time, enabling her to join only three other players who've made the list in multiple seasons. They are: Chamique Holdsclaw (3), Candace Parker (2) and Bridgette Gordon (2).

- Alexa Middleton is UT's fourth-leading scorer at 8.0 ppg .
$\square$ Diamond DeShield is shooting .456 from the field, including .467 from the three-point arc, and averaging 15.8 ppg . over the past five games.


## STATISTICALLY SPEAKING

UT averaged 8.3 turnovers per game over its last three contests and 12.5 over its last 10 vs. 14.0 for the entire season.
When she plays 15 or more minutes per game, which she has done six times, Schaquilla Nunn is averaging 10.0 points and 9.8 rebounds and shooting $\mathbf{6 0 0}$ from the field.
$\square$ Nunn recorded the 45th double-double of her career, her first as a Lady Vol, when she piled up 15 points and 15 rebounds vs. Alabama.

Tennessee has won the battle of the boards in $\mathbf{1 8}$ of $\mathbf{2 6}$ games, including 12 of the past 16 . UT's rebound margin for the year is +3.0 .

- UT was only the second team this season to out-rebound Mississippi State, doing so with a 4839 advantage.
$\square$ Mercedes Russell has the fifth-highest singleseason rebounding average in UT history (9.4).
- Jaime Nared currently has the fifth-highest single-season free throw percentage in UT history at .884 and is fifth in career average thus far at .828 .
- In all games, Tennessee is averaging 74.5 points per game and shooting .436 from the field and .343 from the three-point line.
That scoring average is nearly nine points better than last season's total of 65.6 ppg .
$\square$ At home, UT is averaging 78.5 and shooting .458 (FG) and . 390 (3FG). On the road, the Lady Vols are scoring 69.8 ppg. and shooting .411 from

the field and .293 on threes. UT hits .761 of its free throws on the road and .749 at home.

UT has held 19 of 26 opponents to .410 or lower shooting from the field. Auburn (.508); Notre Dame, (.483), South Carolina (.459), Texas (.452) and Florida (.449), Georgia (.459), Missouri (.491) are the exceptions.

- South Carolina was giving up 54.4 points per game, and Tennessee tallied 76 in the win. Only UT, Ohio State (80) and Duke (74) had reached 70 vs. USC this season.
- LSU was allowing 58.1 per game, and Tennessee tallied 77 in the victory. South Carolina scored 84 on LSU, while UConn produced 76.

Florida was giving up 72.6 points per game and Tennessee scored 84. The Gators had allowed more only once, surrendering 102 to Indiana on Dec. 20.

- The 71 points Tennessee scored in the win over Notre Dame were the second-most allowed by the Irish all season. The 69 points UT held the ND to were the fewest scored by Muffet's McGraw's squad in the series since 2008.

Tennessee has 2420 -point scoring games spread over five different players this season, with Diamond DeShields leading with nine (eight in last 13 games), followed by Jaime Nared (6), Mercedes Russell (5) and Alexa Middleton (3).
■ UT has allowed 70 or more points only nine times this year and has held seven teams under 60.

- The Lady Vols are 9-3 this season when they record seven or more steals in a game. Their losses were Ole Miss, Auburn and Georgia.

Tennessee is 13-2 when it outscores or ties its opponents in fast-break points.

UT held Vandy without a fast-break point on Jan. 5, marking the only time this season UT had held an opponent without any.

- Tennessee forced Vanderbilt into 21 turnovers on Jan. 5, tying the season high for a Lady Vol opponent (with Tennessee State).

Tennessee generated a season-high 29 points off 17 Vandy turnovers on Jan. 22 and followed that with $\mathbf{2 0}$ vs. Florida.

After beating Vanderbilt, 91-63 (+28), Tennessee now has seven wins of 25 points or more this season and three of 30 or more. In 2015-16, UT had only five wins with a margin of $25+$ and three victories of $30+$ all year long.

- UT is 8-8 in games in which it surrenders double-figure totals in points off turnovers. It is 11-2 when it surrenders 10 or fewer.
- The Lady Vols have won all four quarters on five occasions this season, including vs. Navy, ETSU, Tennessee State, UNCW and LSU.

Tennessee has shot 50 percent or better in all
four quarters this season vs. ETSU and LSU.
RUSSELL PILING UP DOUBLE-DOUBLES
In 97 career games Mercedes Russell has 25 double-doubles. That ranks 10th in school history and is third among active SEC players.

Russell had 0 as a freshman, 11 as a sophomore and 14 this year (second in SEC and tied for third all-time among UT juniors with Candace Parker).

- The 11 in 2015-16 tied for third-best all-time by a Lady Vol sophomore with Mary Ostrowski and ranked behind only Candace Parker (21) and Chamique HoldsIcaw (16).

Russell has recorded 10 double-doubles in the past 21 games. Russell hit the mark against Penn State (19 pts., 11 rebs.), Virginia Tech (17 pts., 14 rebs.), vs. \#4 Baylor ( 22 pts., 12 rebs.), vs. \#10/10 Stanford (11 pts., 13 rebs.) and vs. Troy (18 pts./11 rebs.), UNCW (20 pts., 11 rebs.), Vanderbilt1 (15 pts./13 rebs.), Mississippi State1 (17 pts./14 rebs.), Auburn (26 pts./11 rebs.), South Carolina (16 pts./10 rebs.), Georgia (24 pts./17 rebs.) and Texas A\&M (17 pts./11 rebs.).

- Warlick is 124-44 as a head coach and 886-176 all-time as an assistant.
- Warlick is 57-20 in SEC play, 8-3 during the SEC Tournament and 59-21 vs. non-conference foes.
$\square$ Her NCAA Tournament record is 11-4.
MERCEDES JOINS UT TOP 10 IN BLOCKS
Mercedes Russell blocked three shots vs. Va. Tech to break into the UT career top 10, surpassing Chamique Holdsclaw (111) to take over 10th place with 112. Russell now has 145 through 26 games, standing in sole possession at No. 7, just ahead of Tamika Catchings (136).
- Russell leads Tennessee with 39 this season.

■ Her career average of 1.5 currently ranks her sixth all-time at Tennessee.
■ Russell tallied 66 rejections last season, a mark that ties as the eighth-best in a year by a Lady Vol.
■ She's led Tennessee in blocks during the two previous seasons she played (2013-14/2015-16).

## AYER DEVELOPMENT

Much is made of player development within a program, and clearly progress can be seen in the case of several players on this year's team.
$\square$ Mercedes Russell provides exhibit A, with the 6-6 redshirt junior improving from points/rebounds averages of $6.5 / 5.0$ as a freshman, 9.9/8.3 as a redshirt sophomore and 16.7/9.4 as a redshirt junior.

- Another example is Jaime Nared, with the junior moving up from 5.2/3.5 as a freshman, 8.3/4.8 as a sophomore and $15.1 / 6.6$ as a junior.
■ Junior Alexa Middleton and sophomore Meme Jackson offer two more examples, going from 3.0/1.2 to 8.0/2.3 (34 of 88 on threes), in the case of Middleton, and from 1.0/0.6 to 5.2/1.9 for Jackson.
■ Even in the case of Diamond DeShields, who burst onto the scene as a freshman star at North Carolina, the 6-1 guard has improved her overall game on both ends of the floor while working through injuries, with UT head coach Holly Warlick calling her one of the team's best defensive players. DeShields went from averaging $14.3 / 5.2$ as a sophomore to 17.3/6.5 this year.

RUSSELL HOLDING DOWN HER PEERS
Mercedes Russell's production on the offensive end has been extremely noticeable, but her effort on defense is worthy of praise as well.

- Russell held Stanford's Erica McCall (17.2 ppg., 8.6 rpg .) to 13 points, six boards on 6-of-15 shooting.
- Against Baylor, Russell handled the Lady Bears'
rotation of bigs in dominant fashion.
- Russell limited starting center Beatrice Mompremier to six points on 3-of-12 shooting and eight rebounds and forced her into two turnovers.
- Reserve Kalani Brown fared worse, going 1-for9 for two points and four rebounds with two fouls in 11 minutes.

Lauren Cox took her turn and went 0-for-3 with three boards and four quick fouls in seven minutes.

- She helped limit Kentucky center Alyssa Rice to six points and seven rebounds and UNCW center Rebekah Banks to 10 points and five boards.
- Mississippi State's 6-5 Chinwe Okorie got in foul trouble battling Russell and finished with zero points and four rebounds. Okorie's sub, 6-7 Teaira McCowan, finished with 14 points and nine boards, as Russell countered with 17 points and 14 boards while playing all 40 minutes

Notre Dame's Brianna Turner finished 5-of-12 with 10 points and seven rebounds.

South Carolina's Alaina Coates finished 3-of-7 with seven points and nine rebounds.

LADY VOL LINE-UP NEWS
Tennessee has a roster of nine available players this year, but seven are seeing most of the action.

- Holly Warlick has utilized five different starting lineups in 26 games, with the quintet of Nared, Russell, Jackson, DeShields and Reynolds getting the most nods (15) including wins over \#5/4 South Carolina, \#6 Notre Dame, \#10/10 Stanford and \#17/23 Kentucky in its 9-6 record as a unit.
$\square$ Only Russell and Nared have started every game this season.
- Reynolds (missed TSU game) has started 25 games, DeShields (missed Troy, UNCW games) 24, Jackson 18, Middleton seven and Nunn four.
- True freshman Kamera Harris has played in seven games this season.
- Missed Games Due To Injury (3): Jordan Reynolds (TSU - L hamstring); Diamond DeShields (Troy/UNCW - R hand).


## COMEBACKS/LEADS/DEFICITS

UT has three wire-to-wire wins this season, coming against Troy and in back-to-back meetings with Vanderbilt ( $1 / 22$ ) and Florida ( $1 / 26$ ).

- Tennessee has trailed in 23 of 26 games this
season and come back to win 13 times.
- The Lady Vols have been behind at the half nine times: BU (-20), PSU/ND (-13), MSU1 (-7), TEX (-5), ALA (-4), UGA (-3), AUB (-1) and are 2-7 in those contests. The wins were vs. Notre Dame and Mizzou.
- The Big Orange women have led at the half in 16 games and are 13-3 in that scenario, with the only losses coming at Virginia Tech and Ole Miss and at home vs. Texas A\&M.
$\square$ UT was tied at the half once (STAN, win).
- The largest first-half deficit was 21 (BU), while
the largest second-half deficit was 35 (BU).
- The largest deficit overcome to win this season was a 15-point margin vs. \#6/6 Stanford in the second quarter ( 13 at the half $/ 14$ in the third).
$\square$ The second largest deficit overcome to win this season was an 11-point margin vs. \#10/10 Stanford in the first quarter.

UT came back from nine-down in the first quarter to win at \#5/4 South Carolina.
The Lady Vols overcame an eight-point, secondquarter deficit to Missouri to win.

- Tennessee dug itself out of a 15-point deficit at Texas, took the lead by two and lost by five.
- The Lady Vols trailed Ole Miss by 12 in the second quarter, led by 13 in the third and lost by five. ■ UT erased all but two points from a 15-point deficit vs. Penn State, but ended up losing by 14.
■ The Lady Vols erased all but one point from a 13-point fourth quarter deficit vs. Va. Tech before losing by four.
$\square$ UT lost leads of 17 (1Q, Auburn), 13 (3Q, Ole
Miss) and 11 (4Q, 8:49, Texas A\&M) before losing.
- The largest deficit UT overcame to win in 2015-16 was vs. Green Bay (down eight, 5:17/2Q).
- Tennessee has overcome three fourth-quarter deficits (JMU, -1/ND, -10/USC -1) to win in 2016-17.
- UT overcame four fourth-quarter deficits to win last season.
- The biggest deficit (23) and halftime deficit (20) ever overcome for a victory by UT were vs. Rutgers (55-51) on Jan. 3, 2009.
- The largest deficit overcome for a win with Warlick as coach was vs. Gonzaga in Spokane, Wash., on March 28, 2015, with UT trailing by 17, 57-40, with 6:34 remaining in the NCAA Sweet 16.
■UT also rallied from 17-down for a 52-46 win over Virginia in the 1996 Elite Eight to reach the Final Four and win the Lady Vols' fourth NCAA title.
- The biggest first-half deficits overcome for wins in the Warlick era were 15 in the first half vs. Alabama (Feb. 2, 2014) and LSU (March 7, 2014).
- The largest home halftime deficit overcome (13) during Warlick era was vs. Notre Dame on Jan. 16, 2017, while the biggest road halftime deficit overcome (12) was at Middle Tenn. on Nov. 8, 2013.
$\square$ The largest positive turnaround (31 points) of the Warlick era occured when Alabama led Tennessee by 15 in the first half and then trailed UT by as many as 16 in the second half en route to a 10-point UT win.
- The largest negative turnaround game under Warlick came on Jan. 19, 2017 (40), when UT led by 17 in the first quarter and trailed by 23 in the fourth before losing by 16 at Auburn.
■ The second largest negative turnaround game under Warlick occurred vs. \#2/2 Notre Dame on Jan. 20, 2014 (29), when UT led by 12 in the first half and trailed by as many as 17 in the second half on its way to a 16-point loss. On Jan. 18, 2016, UT led N.D. by four and trailed by 25 (29) before losing by 13 .
- Tennessee's largest margin of victory under Holly Warlick was 68 (110-42) vs. Lipscomb on Dec. 29, 2013.
■ UT's highest point total scored under Warlick was 111 vs. Saint Francis on Dec. 3, 2014, and that 67-point margin of victory is second most.
- Tennessee's largest margin of defeat during the Warlick era was 23 at \#3/3 Baylor (53-76) on Dec. 18, 2012. That game also produced the worst halftime deficit in school history (25).
■ The lowest point total in UT's modern day history came vs. Virginia Tech (43) on Dec. 6, 2015. ■ The lowest point total by a foe during the Holly Warlick era was 36 by TSU on Nov. 30, 2016.


## TRACKING SCORING RUNS

The Lady Vols have posted 22 scoring runs of double-digits this season.

- Tennessee's longest run was a 15-0 spree vs. UNCW, spanning the third and fourth quarter. UT also had another 11-0 burst in the fourth period.
$\square$ UT also had double-digit runs vs. ETSU (13-0, 1Q-2Q / 12-0, 3Q), Navy (11-0, 4Q / 10-0, 3Q-4Q), Tennessee State (10-0, 1Q / 11-0, 2Q / 11-0, 3Q), Appalachian State (10-0, 2Q / 12-0, 3Q-4Q), Stanford (11-0, 2Q / 10-0 3Q-4Q), Troy (10-0, 1Q-2Q / 10-0, 4Q), Vanderbilt1 (12-0, 1Q-2Q), Ole Miss (11-0, 2Q / 11-0, 2Q-3Q), Auburn (14-0, 1Q), Vanderbilt2 (14-0, 2Q-3Q), South Carolina (11-0, 4Q) and Texas A\&M (12-0, 3Q-4Q).
- Tennessee has allowed 12 double-digit runs this season, including a 16-0 2Q run by Penn State. - The others were vs. Va. Tech (13-0, 3Q-4Q), Penn State (13-0, 2Q), Baylor (12-0, 2Q / 11-0 1Q), Troy (11-0, 2Q), Mississippi State (10-0, 2Q), Ole Miss (11-0, 4Q), Auburn (15-0, 1Q-2Q / 14-0, 3Q), Florida (13-0, 1Q-2Q) and Missouri (14-0, 2Q).

MIDDLETON FINDING COMFORT ZONE
Alexa Middleton has scored in double figures
eight times in 2016-17, the most in a season in her career.
■ Middleton scored in double figures for the first time in SEC play this season, and now has accomplished that feat four times ( 19 vs . Vanderbilt, 11 at Florida and 14 vs. Texas A\&M and Alabama).

- After opening the 2017 portion of the schedule in a 1-for-30 shooting slump, Middleton bounced back with double-figures efforts vs. Vanderbilt (19) and Florida (11) and eight vs. South Carolina with two timely three-pointers. It was the first time in her career the junior had scored in double figures in back to back league games.
$\square$ She now leads the team in three-pointers made with 34 in 88 attempts.

Against former Lady Vols as head coaches, Warlick is 9-2, including 5-2 vs. Nikki [Caldwell] Fargas (LSU), 1-0 vs. Tonya Edwards (Alcorn St.) and 2-0 vs. Jody Adams (Wichita State).

COMING BACK FROM INJURIES TAKES TIME
Tennessee has three players who missed entire seasons with injuries, and it took time for them to shake off the rust, get stronger, develop strength and gain confidence again on the court.

- Mercedes Russell (2014-15), Diamond DeShields (2014-15) and Schaquilla Nunn (2015-16) all missed entire seasons, and it has taken varying amounts of time for those players to hit their strides again.

Russell and DeShields (aside from missing games due to a hand injury) have displayed consistent production this season.
$\square$ Nunn, especially when she plays extended minutes, appears to be gaining more comfort on the court and in playing with her teammates, resulting in higher productivity.

- Alexa Middleton and Meme Jackson were plagued by nagging injuries all last season, but both are providing an impact this season with career-best numbers by far.


## PROGRAM'S THIRD TRIPLE-DOUBLE

Jordan Reynolds posted only the third tripledouble in Lady Vol history vs. UNCW on Dec. 29, carding a career-high 14 rebounds as well as 11 points and 10 assists.
$\square$ She followed in the footsteps of Shekinna Stricklen ( $1 / 3 / 10$ - vs. Oklahoma - 17 points, 13 rebounds, 12 assists) and Shelia Collins (2/8/85 - vs. Florida State - 18 points, 10 rebounds, 10 steals).

Reynolds nearly had a triple double the game before, vs. Troy on Dec. 21, tallying a career-high 13 assists, 12 points and eight rebounds for her second career double-double.

That 13-assist effort tied for third in UT history for a single game. Only Dawn Marsh (18 on 3/6/88)


■ Lady Vol all-time great Patricia "Trish" Roberts has been named the University of Tennessee's 2017 SEC Women's Legend. The class will be honored at the 2017 SEC Women's Basketball Tournament, March 1-5, in Greenville, S.C.

- Roberts helped lead Tennessee to a 28-5 record in 1976-77 and was part of the school's first-ever AIAW Final Four team, a squad that finished third nationally. That team helped propel the Lady Vols to the forefront of women's college basketball.
The 6-foot-1 forward/center became UT's first-ever Kodak All-American in 1977 after she averaged 29.9 points and 14.2 rebounds per game and shot 65 percent from the field. Those remain school records, as do her efforts for most points in a game (51), most points in a season (987), most field goals in a game (24), most field goals in a season (428), highest field goal percentage in a career (64.7\%), most rebounds in a game (24) and most rebounds in a season (467).
Roberts was a U.S. Olympic silver medalist in 1976, played in the 1978 World University Games and was captain of the 1979 U.S. National Team. A professional playing career followed, as did a lengthy career as a coach in both the college and professional ranks.
- Roberts is an inductee to the Women's Basketball (2000), University of Tennessee (2003) and Georgia Sports Halls of Fame among several others.
and Holly Warlick (14 on 2/12/78) had more.
The 13 assists also tied Shannon Bobbitt (vs. Gonzaga, 12/16/07) for most in Thompson-Boling Arena history by a woman.

DESHIELDS AMONG QUICKEST TO 1000 POINTS
Diamond DeShields reached the 1,000-point plateau in her college career vs. LSU on February 21, 2016. She hit a three-pointer with 9:38 to go in the third quarter. She entered the game needing five points to reach 1,000 career points.

DeShields became only the sixth player to surpass 1,000 points while in her second season as a Lady Vol and the 45th UT player in a career

- The only Lady Vols to have more points after their sophomore seasons at UT are Chamique Holdsclaw $(1,386)$, Candace Parker $(1,328)$ and Tamika Catchings $(1,274)$.
■ DeShields scored 648 points as a freshman at North Carolina in 2013-14 before sitting out the 2014-15 season due to NCAA transfer rules.

DeShields notched 514 points in 2015-16.
She now has 415 this season, 929 as a Lady Vol and 1,577 overall in 95 college games.

DESHIELDS, RUSSELL ON WATCH LISTS
Juniors Diamond DeShields and Mercedes Russell earned spots on preseason watch lists.
$\square$ DeShields was included in both the Wade and Naismith Trophy Watch Lists. It marked DeShields' third season being on a Naismith list and second straight season on the Wade list.
■ DeShields also made the John R. Wooden Women's Preseason Watch List and the Ann Meyers Drysdale Award Midseason Watch List.

Russell was named to the Naismith Trophy Watch List. It's her first time on any watch list.

- Both players advanced to the Naismith Top 30 Women's Players List.
- On Feb. 6, DeShields was named to the Dawn Staley Award Midseason Watch List.

PRESEASON KUDOS FOR DESHIELDS, RUSSELL
Diamond DeShields was named an AP Preseason All-American Honorable Mention selection, the No. 8 choice of espnW's Preseason Top 25 Players and an All-SEC First Team selection by both the media and coaches.

- Mercedes Russell was an All-SEC Second Team pick by the league coaches.


## SIZING UP THE BIG WIN OVER SO. CAROLINA

The victory over \#5/4 South Carolina on Jan. 30 was UT's third this season over a top-10 foe. The Lady Vols also defeated \#6 Notre Dame (71-61 on Jan. 16), \#10 Stanford (59-51 on Dec. 18).

The win was Tennessee's first over a top-five team on the road since the \#4/4 Lady Vols beat \#5/5 UConn, 70-64, on Jan. 6, 2007.

Last time the Lady Vols defeated a top-five team in any location, was when \#10/9 UT beat \#4/5 South Carolina, 73-61, on March 2, 2014.

It was the highest ranked team an unranked Tennessee team has beaten since toppling \#1/1 Old Dominion in Norfolk, Va., 67-64, on Jan. 25, 1985.

The 76 points Tennessee scored vs. the Gamecocks were the most surrendered to an SEC opponent in Columbia since Florida beat the Gamecocks, 77-63, on Jan. 15, 2009.

Tennessee's point total vs. Carolina was its most in the series since hitting 73 in wins at Columbia ( $1 / 3 / 2013$ ) and in Knoxville (3/2/14) in Holly Warlick's first two seasons.
$\square$ The win snapped a three-game losing skid to USC and evened Holly Warlick's record vs. Dawn Staley at 3-3.

UT snapped USC's 30-game home SEC win streak, run of 24 -straight league games and spree of 30-straight SEC wins (regular season/tourney).

VOL SCHOLAR PATCHES
Six Lady Vols are eligible to wear the Vol Scholar patch, which is an insignia on the uniform that recognizes a student-athlete's academic success. - The patch is awarded to sophomore-andabove student-athletes who have earned either a cumulative 3.0 or a semester 3.0 in either of the previous two terms.
■ Diamond DeShields, Kortney Dunbar and Jordan Reynolds already had patches, and Meme Jackson, Schaquilla Nunn and Mercedes Russell are now eligible for patches after the fall semester.

NARED NAMED SEC CO-PLAYER OF THE WEEK
Tennessee junior forward Jaime Nared, who fired in a career-high 27 points and added five rebounds, three assists and three steals as the Lady Vols upset \#4 South Carolina in Columbia on Monday night, was named the SEC Women's Basketball Co-Player of the Week, the league announced on Tuesday.

- With a full-throated partisan crowd of 13,690 doing its best to discourage her, Nared coolly-hit a pair of free throws with 5.9 seconds remaining to provide the victorious margin.
$\square$ Nared actually hit 5-of-6 free throws in the final 33 seconds to help Tennessee snap a three-game losing skid to USC and end the Gamecocks' 30game SEC home winning streak.
$\square$ The 6-foot-2 native of Portland, Ore. (Westview H.S.) helped UT make it a 2-0 road swing during the voting period, tallying 16 points and grabbing seven boards on Thursday in an 84-75 win at Florida.
$\square$ For the week, Nared averaged 21.5 points, 6.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists and 2.0 steals, helping the Lady Vols improve to 14-7 overall and 5-3 in league play. Her effort was key in enabling Tennessee to snap a two-game road losing skid in league play and even UT's record at 5-5 away from home this season. - Nared became UT's second SEC Player of the Week in 2016-17, following fellow Oregonian Mercedes Russell, who was selected on Jan. 3.

RUSSELL NAMED SEC PLAYER OF THE WEEK
Mercedes Russell was named the SEC Player of the Week on Jan. 3 after averaging 21.0 ppg. and 10.0 rpg. in wins over UNCW and \#17/23 Kentucky. $\square$ It was Russell's first career POTW honor (she had a Freshman of the Week accolade in 2013-14) and UT's first of the season.
■ She shot .643 for the week, putting up a 10-of16 effort with 22 points and nine rebounds vs. UK and posting 20 points and 10 boards while connecting on eight-of-12 shots vs. UNCW.
$\square$ The double-double was her eighth of the season, and she hadscored 20 or more points on three occasions at that point.

## NARED POSTED FOUR CONSECUTIVE D-DS

$\square$ Jaime Nared posted four (consecutive) doubledoubles from Nov. 20 to Dec. 4, has seven total this season and has eight for her career.
$\square$ Nared consecutively posted double digits in points and rebounds at Penn State (18 pts., 11 rebs.), at Virginia Tech (11 pts., 10 rebs.), vs. Tennessee State (16 pts., 10 rebs.) and vs. Baylor (19 pts., 11 rebs.) and added more D-Ds vs. Appalachian State (15 pts., 10 rebs.), Troy (21 pts., 14 rebs.) and LSU ( 26 pts., 10 rebs.).

- That four-game spree tied for the sixth-longest streak of consecutive double-doubles in UT history.
- The longest Lady Vol streak of consecutive double-doubles belongs to Isabelle Harrison, who recorded seven consecutive double-doubles from Dec. 14, 2013 to Jan. 9, 2014.
- Daedra Charles had six straight in 1990-91, while Chamique Holdsclaw (1996-97), Candace Parker (2006-07) and Glory Johnson (2011-12) all recorded streaks of five consecutive double-doubles.

ALL FIVE SCORING IN DOUBLE FIGURES
Twice this season, all five Tennessee starters have scored in double figures.

- The most recent occasion came against Vanderbilt on Jan. 5.
■ The other time it occurred was vs. Troy on Dec. 21.
RECORD FOR MULTIPLE DOUBLE-DOUBLES
The Lady Vols opened with at least one doubledouble in their first seven games of 2016-17 and now have 20 games with at least one double-double.
■ They recorded multiple double-doubles in four consecutive games for the first time in school history (Penn State, Va. Tech, Tenn. State, Baylor) and then added another vs. Troy when a seasonbest three Lady Vols accomplished the feat (Nared, Reynolds, Russell).

The previous school record for consecutive double-doubles occurred in 1984-85 when the Lady Vols had three consecutive games with multiple double-doubles.
$\square$ This year's streak occurred with pts./rebs. double-doubles vs. Penn State (Jaime Nared, 18/11 \& Mercedes Russell, 19/11), Virginia Tech (Russell, 17/14 \& Nared, 11/10), Tennessee State (Nared, 16/10 \& Diamond DeShields, 15/10) and Baylor (Russell, 22/12 \& Nared, 19/11).

Valerie Freeman (20 pts., 14 rebs.) and Shelia Collins (18 pts., 11 rebs.) had double-doubles at Kentucky on Feb. 13, 1985. Collins ( 26 pts., 12 rebs.) and Karla Horton ( 23 pts., 16 rebs.) followed vs. Vanderbilt on Feb. 16. Horton ( 13 pts., 11 rebs.) and Kathy Spinks (11 pts., 10 rebs.) had double-doubles vs. South Carolina on Feb. 18, 1985, to conclude the streak. $\square$ Besides Russell (14) and Nared (7), Diamond DeShields (4), Reynolds (2) and Nunn (1) each have double-doubles, giving UT 28 total for the year, including one of Reynolds' being a triple-double.

A DEEPER LOOK AT TENNESSEE
Tennessee has been to the NCAA Elite Eight in three of Holly Warlick's first four seasons as a head coach. It's something only one other women's coach (Leon Barmore, Louisiana Tech) has done during a career's first four years.

- UT has won three SEC titles during the past four years, including two regular season titles (2013, 2015) and a tourney title (2014).
- The Lady Vols return eight players from last season's NCAA Elite Eight squad and have three newcomers for a roster of 11 . Nine of those players will see action this season, while two (Te'a Cooper and Cheridene Green) redshirt due to injury.
$\square$ Last year's unit finished 22-14 overall and 8-8 in SEC play (t7th) but rallied to earn the program's 28th overall NCAA Elite Eight berth.
- Tennessee has been picked to finish third in the SEC by both the media and the league's coaches, following defending champ South Carolina and 2015-16 runner-up Mississippi State.

Diamond DeShields (first team) and Mercedes Russell (second team) were named to the 2016-17 Coaches Preseason All-SEC Team.

- DeShields also made the five-player Media

Preseason All-SEC Team.

- After ending last season unranked in the AP Poll and 19th in the USA Today Coaches Poll, the Lady Vols opened ranked 13th and 14th, respectively. - In other polls, the U.S. Basketball Writers Association had UT 12th; AP, Sporting News and Athlon Sports had UT ranked 13th; the Lady Vols were 14th in the USA Today Coaches Poll and the espnW Poll (t14); and Lindy's had the Lady Vols at No. 16.


## UT TOP SEC TEAM IN 2016 NCAA TOURNEY

Tennessee was one of nine Southeastern Conference teams to make the 2016 NCAA tourney.

- The Lady Vols made it farther than any other league school, advancing to the Elite Eight before falling to Syracuse in Sioux Falls, S.D.
- The other SEC teams qualifying for the NCAA Tournament and their finishes were Auburn (2nd Rd.), Florida (1st Rd.), Georgia (1st Rd.), Kentucky (Sweet 16), Mississippi State (Sweet 16), Missouri (2nd Rd.) and South Carolina (Sweet 16).


## VACANT CHAIR ON THE BENCH FOR PAT

With legendary Tennessee head coach emeritus Pat Summitt passing away during the offseason on June 28, Holly Warlick decided to honor her former coach, mentor, co-worker and friend by leaving a vacant seat on the Tennessee bench during home games in 2016-17.
$\square$ The orange chair stands out amidst the line of white chairs and includes Summitt's name written on athletic tape. That practice began under Summitt's watch, when student managers used that method to help identify where each person should sit on the Tennessee bench.

## FEWEST POINTS ALLOWED IN GAME SINCE 2011 <br> Tennessee held Tennessee State to only 36

 points on Nov. 30.$\square$ That total was the fewest surrendered by the Lady Vols since beating Stetson, 99-34, on March 19, 2011, in the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

LADY VOLS HONOR GATLINBURG VICTIMS
The Lady Vols wore Gatlinburg shooting shirts in home games vs. Tenn. State and Baylor and donned Smokey Grey uniforms for the contest at Texas.
$\square$ The gestures were in honor of the people in the town of Gatlinburg and the surrounding area who suffered loss of life, property or both during devastating wind-driven wildfires in late November.
$\square$ Former Lady Vol and Gatlinburg native/resident Lisa McGill Reagan (1975-79) and her family lost their home, and their oldest son also lost his home in the fire.

- Reagan was a teammate of Holly Warlick's at Tennessee, with both in the starting lineup together for Pat Summitt during the 1976-77 season.


## LADY VOLS FACE CHALLENGING SLATE

Tennessee ranked No. 1 in strength of schedule last season and once again faces one of the nation's most difficult itineraries.

- Holly Warlick's squad will play 17 regular-season games vs. teams that saw postseason action a year ago, including three NCAA Elite Eight teams (Baylor, Texas, Stanford).
The Lady Vols are set to host Baylor and Notre Dame, and both teams are consistently ranked among the top-two slots in early preseason polls.
$\square$ UT also welcomes other top 10 picks in Stanford and Mississippi State and also travels to MSU as well as South Carolina and Texas.
- Other SEC schools ranked in preseason polls are Kentucky, Missouri, Florida and Auburn.
FOUR STARTERS RETURN FOR UT
Tennessee returns four starters and eight total letterwinners from last year's squad, which wound up 22-14 but made its way to the NCAA Elite Eight. - The Lady Vols' top returnee is 6-1 redshirt junior guard Diamond DeShields, who averaged 14.3 points, 5.2 rebounds, 2.3 assists and 1.6 steals despite an injury that limited her effectiveness.
- DeShields was named AP All-SEC Second Team and made the SEC and NCAA Sioux Falls Regional All-Tournament Teams.
- Redshirt junior center Mercedes Russell returns after averaging 9.9 points and 8.3 rebounds, blocking 66 shots (No. 8 season total in UT history) and shooting 55 percent from the field.
- The 6-6 Russell finished third all-time among UT sophomores with 11 double-doubles, trailing only Candace Parker (21) and Chamique Holdsclaw (16), and made the NCAA Sioux Falls All-Regional

Team after missing all of 2014-15 due to surgery on both feet.

- Tennessee's other two returning starters are $5-11$ senior point guard Jordan Reynolds ( 4.8 ppg., 4.0 rpg ., led team with 89 assts. vs. 55 turnovers) and 6-2 junior guard/forward Jaime Nared (8.3 ppg., 4.8 rpg . after missing first nine games with a broken hand).
- Returning non-starters include 6-2 junior forward Kortney Dunbar ( $3.5 \mathrm{ppg} ., 1.4 \mathrm{rpg}$.), 5-9 junior guard Alexa Middleton ( $3.0 \mathrm{ppg} ., 1.2 \mathrm{rpg}$.) and 5-11 sophomore guard/forward Meme Jackson (1.0 ppg., 0.6 rpg.$)$.

LADY VOLS LOSE FOUR FROM 2015-16 TEAM
$\square$ Four Lady Vols, all graduates, departed after last season.
■ Bashaara Graves (6-2, F, WNBA 2nd Round Draft Pick) and Nia Moore (6-3, C, playing Poland) concluded their Lady Vol careers.
Graves was an AP All-America Honorable Mention and AP All-SEC Second Team selection a year ago ( 10.9 ppg., 7.5 rpg .).
■ Graves finished third on UT's all-time rebound list with 1,044 and was 19th in scoring at 1,509 .

- Moore averaged 2.0 points and 1.9 rebounds in 24 games, starting five of them.
- UT also lost 5-9 redshirt junior guard Andraya Carter ( $4.8 \mathrm{ppg} ., 2.3 \mathrm{rpg}$. in 36 games $/ 25$ starts) and 6-2 senior forward Jasmine Jones ( 5.0 ppg., 4.5 rpg . in six games) to injuries that forced an early end to their careers.
- The four players were part of the first recruiting class for Head Coach Holly Warlick.
■ Graves and Jones earned degrees in sociology, while Moore earned a degree in psychology. Carter finished her undergraduate work in communication studies in August 2015 and began work on a master's in sport psychology during what turned out to be her final season.
- All of the players but Carter were saluted on Senior Night, when Tennessee defeated Georgia on Feb. 28, 2016, 80-60. Carter didn't announce her decision not to return until Aug. 3, 2016.

GRAVES IS 42ND UT PLAYER IN WNBA
Bashaara Graves became the 42nd Tennessee player to compete in the WNBA.

- Graves was chosen with the 22nd overall pick in the second round by the Minnesota Lynx.
- She became the 37th player in Tennessee history and the sixth coached by Holly Warlick to be drafted by a WNBA team.
- Graves is the sixth Tennessee student-athlete taken in the Holly Warlick's four years as head coach. Graves joins Kamiko Williams (2013, 2nd round, 15th pick, New York), Meighan Simmons (2014, 3rd round, 26th pick, New York), Isabelle Harrison (2015, 1st round, 12th pick, Phoenix), Cierra Burdick (2015, 2nd round, 14th pick, Los Angeles) and Ariel Massengale (3rd round, 29th pick).
- Another 2016 graduate, Nia Moore, signed with a foreign team in Poland.
- During the 2016 WNBA season, nine Lady Vols earned roster spots for all or parts of the year.


## COOPER, GREEN OUT WITH INJURIES

- Te'a Cooper, who averaged 8.6 ppg., 1.9 rpg . and 2.1 apg . last season as an SEC All-Freshman performer, suffered a knee injury during the summer and is sitting out the 2016-17 campaign.
- The 5-8 guard started 15 of 36 games a year ago and was Tennessee's fourth-leading scorer.
- Cheridene Green, a 6-3 forward who transferred to UT from ASA Junior College in Brooklyn, N.Y., will join Cooper on the sideline this season.
- A two-time JUCO All-American who averaged 20.5 points, 16.5 rebounds, 3.9 blocks and 2.5 steals per contest as a sophomore, Green suffered a knee injury last year that ended her campaign.

NEW ASSISTANT, RECRUITING DIRECTOR
Sharrona Reaves joined the staff as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator after doing the same at West Virginia. She replaced Kyra Elzy. - Former UT football administrator Heather Ervin was hired as director of recruiting and player personnel to assist Reaves.

SIX MCDONALD'S A-AS ON ROSTER
$\square$ Tennessee has six McDonald's All-Americans on its 2016-17 roster, with five active this season.
■Those players are Te'a Cooper (injured), Diamond DeShields, Alexa Middleton, Jaime Nared, Jordan Reynolds and Mercedes Russell.

- Cooper was the 2015 McDonald's All-American Game Co-MVP, scoring 21 points for the West.
■Russell was the 2013 McDonald's Game MVP, leading the West to victory with 16 points.
- Nared led the West to a win in 2014 with 15 points but came up just short in MVP voting.
■ Tennessee now has had 27 McDonald's AllAmericans on its rosters through the years and will add four more with the 2017 signing class.
$\frac{\text { A LOOK AT UT'S YEARLY RECRUIT RANKINGS }}{\text { Tennessee signed the No. } 1 \text { espnW HoopGurlz }}$ recruiting class for 2017. ProspectsNation.com agrees with that assessment.
UT signed the No. 5 espnW HoopGurlz recruiting class in 2012, No. 3 in 2013, No. 6 in 2014, No. 13 in 2015 (signed \#12 \& \#49 players) and was not ranked in 2016 after the late signing of three players, including a JUCO All-American and an all-conference graduate transfer.
- The 2013 class included No. 1 Mercedes Russell, No. 8 Jannah Tucker and No. 42 Jordan Reynolds, but Tennessee added that year's No. 3 recruit, Diamond DeShields, to the mix as a transfer, while Tucker transferred in 2015.
- The top signees from 2013, 2014 and 2015 are Russell (No. 1), Jaime Nared (No. 6) and Te'a Cooper (No. 12), respectively. Cheridene Green, a 2016 newcomer, is a two-time JUCO All-American.

CELEBRATION OF LIFE HONORS LEGEND
Pat Summitt, the winningest coach in NCAA Division I basketball history, passed away on June 28,2016 , at the age of 64 . She was buried near her hometown of Henrietta, Tenn., on June 30, and a Celebration of Life ceremony was held on July 14 at Thompson-Boling Arena.

- She was born June 14, 1952, in Clarksville, Tenn.
- The coaching legend announced on Aug. 23, 2011, that she was battling early-onset dementia, Alzheimer's type.
- Summitt stepped down as Tennessee's women's basketball coach on April 18, 2012, handing her whistle to her long-time assistant, former player and friend, Holly Warlick.
■ She finished 1,098-208 (.840) in 38 seasons.
- Summitt's teams made a record-setting 31-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances, winning eight NCAA National Championships and finishing second five times while playing in 22 NCAA or AIAW Final Fours.
- She also guided the Big Orange to 16 SEC reg-ular-season titles and 16 SEC Tournament crowns, including victories in the first-ever SEC tourney in 1980 and her final one as head coach in 2012.

The SEC coaches postseason awards were announced on March 1, and Te'a Cooper was named to the SEC Coaches' All-Freshman team.

- Redshirt junior guard Andraya Carter was named to the SEC Community Service Team.
- Carter also earned the Arthur Ashe Jr. Female Sports Scholar of the Year as well as the Arthur Ashe Jr. Women's Basketball Award winner.
- The AP named Diamond DeShields and

Bashaara Graves to its All-SEC Second Team.

- The AP tabbed Bashaara Graves as an Honorable Mention All-American.
- Te'a Cooper was named SEC Freshman of the Week on January 26.
- Graves earned SEC Co-Player of the Week and TSWA Player of the Week on Nov. 24.
- UT had six on the SEC Academic Honor Roll.
- The group included Andraya Carter, Diamond DeShields, Kortney Dunbar, Bashaara Graves, Alexa Middleton and Jaime Nared.


## LADY VOLS HAVE WON 35 SEC TITLES <br> Tennessee has won a combined total of 35

 SEC Championships, claiming its 18th all-time SEC regular-season title in 2015-16.- That regular season co-championship came on the heels of UT's SEC Tournament title in 2013-14.
- The Lady Vols have won SEC regular-season championships in four of the past seven seasons.
■ UT has 17 league tournament titles to its credit, including three straight from 2010 to 2012 and four of the last seven.
■Since 1985, there have been only six seasons where Tennessee didn't win at least a regular season or tournament title. Those came in 1986, 1987, 1991, 1997, 2009 and 2016.
- The Lady Vols have swept SEC regular-season and tournament championships on eight occasions. Those years were 1980, 1985, 1994, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2010 and 2011.
- Tennessee stands first in regular season and tournament titles in conference history with Georgia ranking second with seven regular season trophies and Vanderbilt standing sixth in tourney hardware with six pieces.

SUCCESSFUL START AS HEAD COACH
Holly Warlick's 108-34 record (.761) gave her the seventh-highest victory total ever recorded during the first four years on the job by an NCAA Division I women's basketball coach.

- She won 27 in 2012-13, 29 in 2013-14, 30 in 2014-15 before a 22 -win season in 2015-16.
- Entering the season, Warlick's career (.761) and SEC (.781, 50-14) winning percentages ranked her first among all SEC women's head coaches.
- Her Lady Vols made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2013, 2015 and 2016, making Warlick and Leon Barmore of La. Tech (retired) the only skippers to direct their programs to three NCAA Elite Eight s in their first four seasons as head coaches.
- Tennessee has claimed three SEC trophies in Warlick's first four seasons, winning regularseason crowns in 2013 and 2015 and claiming the tournament title in 2014.

As she spends her fifth season at the helm of the Tennessee Lady Volunteers, Holly Warlick already has built a very impressive résumé in her young head coaching career. Her worksheet contains accomplishments few coaches have achieved in their entire careers, much less as first-time head coaches.

Those successes, indeed, confirm that Warlick was the right choice to take the reins at Tennessee and that she and her staff have the chops to run a championship program. A disciple of the late Pat Summitt, Warlick has maintained the core values of her former coach, co-worker and friend while at the same time employing her own personality, style and competitive energy to coach today's players.

Whether as an All-America player from 197680, an assistant and associate head coach for 27 seasons from 1985 to 2012, or head coach from 2012 to present, Warlick has thrived during her more than three decades in the spotlight at Rocky Top. She enters her fifth year as head coach and 36th season of overall affiliation with the program hoping to build upon last season's NCAA Elite Eight finish.

Vice Chancellor and Director of Athletics Dave Hart named Warlick head coach of the Lady Vols on April 18, 2012, as women's hoops legend Pat Summitt stepped into the role of head coach emeritus. In a touching and symbolic gesture the following day at a press conference announcing the changes, Summitt presented her coaching whistle to her long-time aide and former floor general.

Since that day, Warlick has proven that she was up to the monumental task. Despite being picked to finish as low as fifth in the SEC and 20th nationally, her first squad won the 2013 SEC regular season title and made the NCAA Elite Eight, finishing 27-8/14-2 despite injuries that forced players to miss a combined 53 games. Her 2014 edition went 29-6/13-3, winning an SEC Tournament title and making it to the NCAA Sweet 16.

In 2015, her third team reached the 30-win plateau at 30-6/15-1, claiming a share of the regularseason SEC crown and charting the second NCAA Elite Eight appearance in her three seasons. A year ago, UT took a while to find its way, but Warlick's fourth edition (22-14) did just that and posted another Elite Eight showing at season's end.

During Warlick's first four seasons, six Lady Vols have been taken in the WNBA Draft. Bashaara Graves (2nd Rd.) went in 2016; Isabelle Harrison (1st Rd.), Cierra Burdick (2nd Rd.) and Ariel Massengale (3rd Rd.) were chosen in 2015; Meighan Simmons (3rd Rd.) was taken in 2014 and Kamiko Williams (2nd Rd.) was selected in 2013. Simmons was twice named SEC Player of the Year (2013, 2014) during her UT career.

On the international scene, Warlick became a gold medal coach, and two of her players joined her in earning that hardware. Warlick served as an assistant coach, while Mercedes Russell and Diamond DeShields played on the undefeated (6-0) 2015 USA World University Games Team in South Korea.

From 2012-16, Tennessee also has produced in the classroom, with 13 players earning a total of 26 spots on the SEC Academic Honor Roll. In 2015, Cierra Burdick became Warlick's first CoSIDA Academic All-American, garnering second-team honors and also earned UT Torchbearer, the most prestigious accolade a Tennessee student can receive.

Warlick has been recognized personally for her performance. In 2013, members of the Women's Basketball Coaches Association named her the Spalding Maggie Dixon Division I Rookie Coach of the Year. She was selected by the AP and league coaches as the 2013 SEC Women's Basketball Coach of the Year, and members of the Tennessee Sports Writers Association also chose her as TSWA Women's Basketball Coach of the Year that season.

Warlick and her staff also continue to build for the future on the recruiting trail. They have welcomed seven McDonald's All-Americans in four seasons and feature two of the top three players in the 2013 signing class in Russell and DeShields as well as a top-10 player in Jaime Nared (No. 6, 2014). Te'a Cooper, a 2015 signee, was considered a top 5 player by several rating services.

After Warlick helped shape the direction of Lady Vol basketball as an assistant on Summitt's staff for more than a quarter of a century, the pupil took on greater responsibility and oversaw daily supervision of the basketball office during the 2011-12 season. She also handled a large measure of the media obligations after Summitt's Aug. 23, 2011, announcement regarding the diagnosis of early onset dementia, "Alzheimer's type."

Providing an excellent example of how people rally around each other, the Tennessee staff members pulled together remarkably in the face of that adversity. The end result was a 27-9 overall record, an SEC Tournament Championship and advancement to the NCAA Regional Final.

It's worth noting that Warlick was by Summitt's side, either as a player or an assistant, for 949 of the coach's NCAA-record 1,098 wins and all eight NCAA National Championships. Her value to the program has been evident for some time, as she had held the role of associate head coach since the 2005-06 campaign.

The WBCA also had recognized Warlick's contributions to Tennessee's success through the years, naming Warlick the nation's top assistant coach after she helped lead UT to its seventh national title in 2007. The NCAA Division I women's basketball coaches also recognized Warlick as one of the nation's top assistants in 1998, ranking her prominently in The Women's Basketball Journal poll.

In addition to the NCAA title and coaching honor in 2007, Warlick also teamed up for the first time with former fellow Lady Vol player and assistant Nikki (Caldwell) Fargas, the current head coach at LSU, to pursue her other passion. That pursuit is riding a motorcycle and raising money for the fight against breast cancer.

FEW BEGIN CAREERS WITH SUCCESS LIKE THIS

- Holly Warlick's 108-34 record (.761) gave her the seventh-highest victory total ever recorded during the first four years on the job by an NCAA Division I women's basketball coach.
- Warlick became the 17 th women's basketball coach to win 100 games in her first four seasons at the NCAA Division I level when UT beat Arkansas, 75-57, on Feb. 4, 2016. She's only the sixth since 1992 to do that.
- She joined the legendary Leon Barmore of Louisiana Tech as the only skippers to direct their programs to three NCAA Elite Eight appearances in their first four seasons as head coaches.
- Entering 2016-17, Warlick's career (.761) and SEC (.781, 50-14) winning percentages ranked her first among all SEC women's head coaches.
- Her Lady Vols made it to the NCAA Elite Eight in 2013, 2015 and 2016, and may have extended their runs had it not been for some key injuries the past two seasons.
- Tennessee has claimed three SEC trophies in Warlick's first four seasons, winning regular-season crowns in 2013 and 2015 and claiming the tournament title in 2014.
- Warlick has continued the Lady Vols'100-percent graduation rate for players who have completed their collegiate careers at Tennessee.
- Since becoming head coach, six of her players have been taken in the WNBA Draft. Three, including a first-rounder, were taken in 2015.

Warlick and Fargas created the Champions For A Cause Foundation, a long haul motorcycle ride dedicated to raising funds and awareness for a cure for breast cancer. The charitable organization has raised and donated more than \$150,000. Past trips include the inaugural ride from San Francisco to Knoxville as well as trips from the Badlands to Las Vegas and from Knoxville to Key West, Fla., New Orleans, Niagara Falls and, most recently in 2013 and 2014, Panama City, Fla.

On Feb. 10, 2008, Warlick and Fargas presented a \$10,000 check to the late N.C. State Head Coach Kay Yow and the Kay Yow/WBCA Cancer Fund. At Tennessee's "Live Pink, Bleed Orange" game vs. Vanderbilt on Feb. 17, 2013, three checks worth $\$ 15,000$ were presented by Champions for a Cause to the UT Breast Health Outreach Program, Kay Yow Cancer Foundation and the Brady James Foundation to help raise money for breast cancer research. Those presentations to organizations have become an annual event, thanks to fundraising efforts and the generosity of many.

Warlick also presented a special pink basketball to her sister, Marion Ferrill, prior to the start of that game in 2013. Ferrill was diagnosed with breast cancer in the fall of 2012 and was pronounced cancer free on Sept. 30 after undergoing surgery shortly after her diagnosis.

With all of her accomplishments in coaching and in her charitable endeavors it might be easy to overlook the fact that Warlick left just as powerful a mark on women's hoops as a player at UT.

It doesn't seem that long ago that the charismatic Knoxville native was flying up and down the court as an All-America Lady Vol point guard.

For more than three decades, Warlick has been considered the finest point guard ever to play for the Lady Vols. In addition to being selected to the CONVERSE/Lady Vol Team of the Decade for the 1980s in January of 1994, five different halls of fame opened their doors to her.

On Feb. 27, 2004, she was inducted into the Tennessee Sports Hall of Fame. In October 2002, she became a member of the University of Ten-
nessee Lady Vol Hall of Fame in the second class of inductees. In June 2001, the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame selected Warlick as one of 10 inductees enshrined into the Hall for the Class of 2001. For the hometown girl, who grew up in the Rocky Hill section of Knoxville and graduated from Bearden High School, it was a dream-cometrue.

In the summer of 1994, Warlick gained admission to her first hall of fame. She was honored as one of the City of Knoxville's finest all-time athletes with her inclusion in the Greater Knoxville Sports Hall of Fame.

Including the 2015-16 season, Warlick has invested 35 years in the program, having helped shape UT into a national powerhouse with tenure as both a player and a coach. Warlick's expertise and major contributions to the team as an assistant came from her work with the guards. Simmons, Ariel Massengale, Shekinna Stricklen, Kara Lawson, Angie Bjorklund and Shanna Zolman are just a few of the successful players Warlick helped recruit and coach as an assistant coach.

Warlick's association with the Lady Vols started in 1976 when she joined the program as a scholarship 400-meter track athlete who ended up walking on to the basketball team. Soon, she would become the most prolific player in the history of Tennessee Lady Vol basketball.

Warlick was the first player in Tennessee athletics (men or women) to have her jersey retired (number 22) at the end of her career in 1980. Bearden, her prep alma mater in Knoxville, retired Warlick's high school jersey (also No. 22) prior to a home football game on Oct. 26, 2012.

Known as a play-making wiz during her four years as UT's point guard, Warlick was once tabbed the "best player in the South." As a rookie, Warlick helped lead the Lady Vols to their first Final Four appearance in school history in 1977. She had no trouble adjusting her enthusiasm and knowledge of the game into the coaching role.

In 19 of the past 35 years Warlick has been affiliated with UT, she has found herself at the Final Four as a player $(1977,1979,1980)$ or as a coach (1986, 1987, 1988, 1989, 1991, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2000, 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2007 and 2008). Her best Final Four showing as a player was national championship runner-up in her senior season. As a coach, she has helped the Lady Vols grab the brass ring all eight times (1987,

1989, 1991, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2007 and 2008).
A three-time All-American while playing for Summitt from 1976-80, Warlick previously held UT records for most assists in a game (14), most steals in a contest (nine), most assists in a season (225) and most games in a career (142). She continues to hold the Lady Vol single-season steals record with 141 in 1978-79.

Warlick possesses vast international playing experience as well. In addition to being a member of the 1980 U.S. Olympic Team, which did not compete in the Moscow Olympics, Warlick and the 1980 U.S. team won gold at the 1980 FIBA Olympic Qualifying Tournament.

She also captured a gold medal playing for the USA at the 1979 FIBA World Championship, marking the first gold medal for the USA at the FIBA World Championships since 1957 and breaking a streak of five-straight golds by the USSR, a silver medal at the 1979 Pan American Games and gold at the 1979 R. William Jones Cup. Additionally, she served as a player representative on the USA BASKETBALL council and was a member of the USOC Advisory Council for Basketball.

In recognition of being a former Olympian, Warlick earned the distinct honor of running the Olympic torch through Knoxville as it made its way to the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, Ga. Post-collegiately, she was a WPBL All-Star, leading the Nebraska Wranglers to the championship of the Women's Professional Basketball League in 1981.

Prior to joining the Tennessee staff for the 1985-86 season, Warlick gained experience at two other stops on the coaching circuit. She was an assistant coach at Virginia Tech from 1981-83 and an assistant from 1983-85 at Nebraska.

A native of Knoxville, Warlick earned her B.S. in marketing from Tennessee in 1981 and her master's degree in athletic administration from Virginia Tech in 1983. Warlick added "biker" to her vitae in 2001. To commemorate her induction into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, a number of Warlick's friends got together and presented her with a Harley-Davidson "Sportster" motorcycle. Just six years later, Warlick already was using her love of the bike towards a greater cause, establishing the Champions For A Cause Foundation with Fargas.

-Averaging 10.1 points, 2.6 assists, 2.5 rebounds and 1.3 steals per game and hitting 47.2 percent of her shots and $\mathbf{5 0 . 0}$ percent of her three pointers in the Lady Vols' victories.

- Scoring 9.9 points per game while shooting 33-of-68 (.485) from the floor over UT's last eight games.
- Stepped up in UT's game against Alabama, scoring 14 points and tying her season high in rebounds with five. -Tallied 14 points, four assists and two steals in Tennessee's game against Texas A\&M.
- Returned to the starting lineup for the first time since UNCW, posting six points and four assists in 34 minutes against Missouri.
- Hit a clutch 3-pointer in the middle of the fourth quarter to push the Lady Vols' lead to nine and help lead Tennessee past \#4 South Carolina on the road. She finished with eight points on the night.

- Scored a career high 21 points on 6-of-7 shooting from behind the arc against Navy.
- Notched 18 points on 4-of-4 shooting from behind the three-point line while also adding a career-high five steals in 26 minutes off the bench as the Lady Vols defeated JMU 81-69.
- Notched a season-best 15 points, five rebounds and six assists on 5 -of- 8 shooting in the season opener against Central Arkansas.
- She became the 18th freshman to start her first game as a Lady Vol, carding a double-double of 20 points and 11 assists in the opener vs. Penn, recording the most assists by a Lady Vol in a freshman debut.
