➤ This is the 34th meeting between the Crimson Tide and Razorbacks and the 16th in Fayetteville. Arkansas leads the overall series, 19-14, and has won the last four straight against Alabama. The Tide's last two victories versus the Razorbacks have come in Fayetteville with the most recent taking place on Feb. 27, 2011, by a score of 92-79. Arkansas has won 10 of the previous 15 matchups in Fayetteville.

✤ Senior Nikki Hegstetter ranks eighth amongst Southeastern Conference active block leaders with 86 for her career. She is also 10th on the active rebounding leaders list with 540.

▶ Entering today's game, senior Nikki Hegstetter has started 93 games overall in her career, tying her for seventh all time with Betsy Harris for most games started in a career at Alabama.



ABOUT ALABAMA'S OPPONENT - ARKANSAS

Arkansas is under the direction of second-year head coach Jimmy Dykes. In his first season with the Razorbacks, Dykes' squad advanced to the NCAA tournament and picked up a win in the opening round against Northwestern.

>> The Razorbacks have had much success at home as nine of their 10 wins this season have come in Fayetteville in Bud Walton Arena. Four of those victories have come in Southeastern Conference play against No. 13 Texas A&M (67-61), No. 13 Tennessee (64-59), No. 24 Missouri (64-52) and Vanderbilt (57-56).

➤ Arkansas is led in scoring by junior Jessica Jackson, who averages 16.5 points per game. She also pulls in 6.6 rebounds per contest, which is the second highest rebounding mark on the team behind senior Melissa Wolff, who averages 7.5 boards.

COLUMBIA, Mo. - Alabama fell at Missouri, 63-52, Thursday night in a game that saw 10 lead changes and four ties. With the loss, the Crimson Tide moves to 14-11 overall and 3-9 in Southeastern Conference games, while the win brings the Tigers to 19-6 on the season and an even 6-6 in league play.

It was a back-and-forth first quarter between Alabama and Missouri. The Tigers led early on before consecutive three pointers from freshman Shaquera Wade gave the Tide a 10-8 advantage at the 6:52 mark. Alabama pulled in front by four 30 seconds later after sophomore Karyla Middlebrook knocked down a pair of free throws, but the Tide would go scoreless for the next four minutes allowing Missouri to take the lead back at 3:06. Alabama would go on to score seven of the final 11 points of the first to take a 19-17 lead into the first break.

The two teams traded threes to start the second before the Tigers scored seven unanswered over a one-minute span to lead by six, 28-22. Missouri outscored Alabama throughout the quarter and went on to take a nine-point advantage into the locker room at the half, 37-28.

Junior Jordan Frericks hit a jumper at the 9:03 mark of the third quarter to start the scoring and give the Tigers their first double-digit lead of the game. The Tide, however, countered with the next six straight to cut its deficit to five with 5:17 to go. Alabama continued to chip away and eventually got it down to one on the final basket of the quarter, which was scored by senior Nikki Hegstetter off the feed from sophomore Hannah Cook.

Another Cook-to-Hegstetter basket gave the Tide a 44-43 lead with 9:16 remaining. Missouri then scored the next three points and eventually pushed its lead back out to eight at the 4:29 mark. The Tide cut it to four but would come no closer down the stretch.

Cook led all scorers in the game with 15 points while Middlebrook followed with 11 in addition to a team-high six rebounds. Junior Sierra Michaelis finished as the Tigers' leader in points with 14.

For the game, Alabama was 35.6 percent (16-45) from the floor, while Missouri hit 38.9 percent (21-54) of its attempts. The Tigers edged the Tide in rebounds, 36-31, but distributed the ball extremely well, collected 16 assists compared to Alabama's eight.

ALABAMA 11-2 WHEN THREE OR MORE IN DOUBLE FIGURES

Alabama is 11-2 on the season when at least three scorers finish in double figures. The two losses came at No. 22/23 Florida, 80-72, and at Vanderbilt, 67-52. Sophomore Hannah Cook leads the way with 16 double-figure games this season.

BALANCED ATTACK

The Crimson Tide has had at least three players score in double figures in 13 of its 25 games this season. Alabama had a whopping seven reach 10 points or more in the season opener versus Alabama A&M, four in the win over Appalachian State, five in the victory against Mississippi Valley State, four against Georgia State, three versus Utah Valley, six against Alcorn State, four versus Georgetown and three against North Florida, Grambling State, Lipscomb and Georgia, four at Florida and three at Vanderbilt.

FREE THROW IMPROVEMENT

Alabama is much improved at the free throw line compared to a season ago where the Crimson Tide hit 63.0 percent. Through 25 games, Alabama is averaging 70.8 percent from the charity stripe, ranking fifth in the Southeastern Conference. That percentage is also the best mark for Alabama since the 1994-95 season when the Tide finished at 70.9 percent.

GETTING TO THE LINE

Alabama ranks 29th in the nation in free throw attempts (510) and 33rd in free throws made (361) while averaging 70.8 percent made per game. Last year, the Tide finished the regular season ranked third in free throw attempts, taking 723 shots from the line in 2014-15.

ALABAMA WINS 10 STRAIGHT AT HOME

With its 62-45 victory over LSU on Jan. 3, Alabama won its 10th home game of the season. The last time the Crimson Tide went 10-0 to start the season at home was in 1997-98 when it won 12 consecutive games.

HOME SCORING

Through 15 home games, Alabama is averaging 71.7 points per game and has scored 90 or more points four times. A year ago, the Crimson Tide only averaged 60.1 points per game in Tuscaloosa.

TIDE HAD BEST SEC START SINCE 2006

With its 64-50 win on Sunday, Jan. 17 against Georgia, Alabama collected its second victory of the Southeastern Conference season in five games played. The last time the Crimson Tide had won two of its first five league contests was in 2006.

MARTINEZ CRACKS MOST BLOCKS IN A GAME TOP 10 LIST TWICE IN TWO GAMES

Sophomore Diamanté Martinez cemented her name in the top 10 in blocks in a single game twice this season. Her six rejections on Nov. 13 versus Alabama A&M tied for third in Alabama history for blocks in a single game and was the most since Yolanda Watkins collected the same amount on Dec. 4, 1994, against Tennessee State. She followed that up with five against Appalachian State, which ranks seventh in the Tide annals.

ALL ABOUT THAT PACE

It doesn't take long to pick up on the importance of the word "pace" with this season's squad. It is one thing that head coach Kristy Curry preaches, and it has certainly paid dividends. Through 25 games, Alabama has forced 495 turnovers with nearly half of those (248) coming from steals. Curry attributes a lot of the improvement to strength and conditioning coach Terry Jones. Although a veteran coach with over 28 years of experience at Alabama, Jones joined the women's basketball team in the spring of 2015 and has made an immediate impact on the squad.

YOUTH LEADS TIDE IN NUMBERS

Throughout the 2014-15, Alabama was led statistically by its youth, and that trend is continuing this season. After 25 games, the Tide's freshmen and sophomores have accounted for 1,273 of its 1,655 points (76.9 percent), 584 of its 946 rebounds (61.7 percent), 193 of its 272 assists (71.0 percent), 81 of its 124 blocks (65.3 percent) and 189 of its 248 steals (76.2 percent).

GRIT AND GRATITUDE

One of the team's mottos for this season that you will hear head coach Kristy Curry talk a lot about is grit and gratitude. At the beginning of the season she said, "We talk a lot about grit, and we talk a lot about gratitude. We want to be the grittiest and the most thankful in everything that we do, on and off the floor. If we can do those two things the scoreboard will take care of itself."

THE HARD HAT

Over the summer, the team read Jon Gordon's book titled *The Hard Hat*, which is the true story of George Boiardi, a selfless, loyal, joyful, hard-working, competitive and compassionate leader and teammate and the impact he had on his team and program. Head coach Kristy Curry had a white hard hat with the script crimson A put on it before the season, and each week, the team votes on its hard hat winner for that respective week. The last winner was freshman Shaquera Wade.

FORZA TIDE

The Alabama women's basketball team embarked on a 10-day tour of Italy in August, visiting Rome, Florence, Venice and Como. Not only did the Crimson Tide come home with a wealth of knowledge about the country and its history, but it also gained valuable on-court time, playing three games against three different teams of varying levels. Sophomore Hannah Cook averaged 17.0 points per game to lead the UA offense largely in part to going 13-for-21 from three-point range. Junior Breanna Hayden was solid all-around for the Tide as she finished with an average of 9.3 points per game, a team-best 6.3 rebounds and 2.7 assists per contest.

HEGSTETTER NAMED CANDIDATE FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Senior forward Nikki Hegstetter was selected as one of the 30 NCAA Division I women's basketball student-athletes in the running for the 2016 Senior CLASS Award. To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. The 30 candidates will be narrowed down to 10 finalists in February, and those 10 will be placed on the official ballot. Ballots will be distributed through a nationwide voting system to media, coaches and fans, who will select one male candidate and one female candidate who best exemplify excellence in the four Cs of community, classroom, character and competition.

HEGSTETTER NAMED ALLSTATE WBCA GOOD WORKS NOMINEE FOR THIRD CONSECUTIVE SEASON

Senior forward Nikki Hegstetter was named a nominee for the 2016 Allstate WBCA Good Works Teams, marking the third time she has been recognized. The award recognizes a select group of college basketball student-athletes who have made significant contributions to the greater good of their communities through volunteerism and civic service. Hegstetter continues to be involved in several aspects of the community, including Habitat for Humanity, The Miracle League of Tuscaloosa and Alabama women's basketball's Fifth Grade Fastbreak program. She has also spent time volunteering at local high school basketball camps, elementary schools, the DCH Manderson Cancer Center and Capstone Village Retirement Community.

FANS EXCITED ABOUT WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

Season ticket sales have increased over 50 percent since Kristy Curry took over at the Capstone. Each season a new attendance record has been set, with the most recent coming on Sunday, Jan. 17, when 3,732 were on hand for the Crimson Tide's win over Georgia. That number also ranks 13th among all Alabama women's basketball attendance figures, which includes games at Coleman Coliseum. Alabama's average attendance has continued to grow and is up an average of 1,496 per game since Curry's arrival (1,145 in 2012-13; 1,992 in 2013-14; 2,550 in 2014-15; 2,641 in 2015-16).

ALABAMA INKS THREE DURING EARLY SIGNING PERIOD

The Alabama women's basketball team added three of the top prospects in the 2016 class with the signing of Cierra Johnson, Ashley Knight and Jordan Lewis.

"All three of these young ladies bring a style of play that is fun to watch, and all three are truly committed to making an immediate impact in our process," said Curry. "This class compliments our current roster and will compete on a daily basis to impact our program both on and off the court in a major way as freshmen."





Alabama defeated the Appalachian State Mountaineers, 93-59, in Foster Auditorium. The Crimson Tide scored at least 90 points for the second consecutive game for the first time since 2001. Alabama improved to 2-0 on the season, while the Mountaineers dropped to 0-2.

Breaking her career-high in scoring while tying her career-best in rebounds, sophomore Meoshonti Knight paced the team to the victory Knight put up 20 points, four more points than her previous best, along with bringing in eight rebounds. Senior Nikki Hegstetter scored career-high 17 points, shooting 6-for-8 from the field, while sophomore Hannah Cook scored 15 points and junior Breanna Hayden tallied 13 points.

The game got off to a sluggish start, as both teams compiled double-digit fouls in the first quarter. Alabama converted four field goals in the opening 10 minutes, but held Appalachian State without a basket until only 32 seconds remained in the quarter. The Tide began to pull away in the second quarter, eventually taking a 51-26 advantage into the locker room. Knight led all scorers at that point with 14.

Alabama used a hot-shooting third guarter to put the game away, draining 10 of its 18 shots, including a perfect 4-of-4 from Hegstetter.

For the game, Alabama earned 32 points of 27 forced turnovers and held the Mountaineers to 27 percent (17-64) from the floor while the Tide shot 43 percent (30-70). The Tide dished out 13 assists and rejected nine shots.

Alabama remains unbeaten at home after defeating Georgetown at Foster Auditorium. The Crimson Tide made a season-high nine three-pointers and used a 19-0 run in the third quarter to secure the victory. Alabama held the Hoyas scoreless over the final seven minutes of the third to take a 60-39 lead.

It was a sluggish opening period for both teams, as the first points of the game came more than two minutes in thanks to a jumper by sophomore Karyla Middlebrook. Alabama remains undefeated at home, picking up a 68-49 victory over Lipscomb on Monday evening in its final non-conference game of the season. The Crimson Tide used a 21-5 run to close the first half and produced a total of 31 points off of 21 Lady Bison turnovers. The nine straight wins at home is the best start in Tuscaloosa since 2006.

Alabama held the lead by as many as six points in Audoama heid the lead by as many as six points in the opening quarter, but went scoreless for the remaining three minutes of the period to allow Lipscomb to pull within two at 14-12. The Tide dominated the second quarter, outscoring the Lady Bison 27-10, including an extended 21-5 run over the final 5:50 to head into the locker room with a comfortable 41-22 advantage. Hegstetter also hauled in seven rebounds along with shutting down Lipscomb's leading scorer, Ashley Southern, who came into the game averaging a double-double at 21.8 points and 10.5 rebounds.
