HOME SWEET HOME

The Rutgers women's basketball team is back home after spending the last four games on the road with trips to the Paradise Jam and Florida State. The Scarlet Knights open a fivegame homestand on Sunday against Arkansas and along the way will meet Iona, MEAC Champions Savannah State, NCAA at-large selection LSU and culminate with the Big Ten opener against Minnesota.

RU is coming off a 65-43 setback to No. 13/14 Florida State in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, a loss which snapped a four-game Scarlet Knight win streak. Junior guard Tyler Scaife was the lone Scarlet Knight in double digits with 10 points.

On the boards against the Seminoles, senior forward Ariel Butts grabbed a game-high nine rebounds, while sophomore guard Shrita Parker and freshman forward Victoria Harris each pulled in a career-high six boards.

Head coach C. Vivian Stringer will be honored for becoming the all-time victories leader in basketball at Rutgers and Tyler Scaife will be presented her 1,000 career point game ball prior to tip. The first 500 fans entering the RAC for Sunday's contest with the Razorbacks will also receive a free Rutgers t-shirt.

ABOUT ARKANSAS

The Razorbacks make the trip to New Jersey with a 2-5 overall record and looking to snap a five-game losing streak. Arkansas opened the season with wins over Southeastern Louisiana (97-53) and Sam Houston State (67-47), but has since dropped five straight. More recently the Razorback fell, 69-54, to Missouri State on Wednesday night.

Jessica Jackson leads Arkansas at 17.6 points per game and 8.0 rebounds. She is the only Razorback averaging double digits.

Kelsey Brooks follows on the stat sheet at 8.9 points per contest and is followed by Jordan Danberry at 7.7 points per game.

Last season the Razorbacks finished at 18-14 overall, including a 6-10 mark in SEC play. Arkansas reached the SEC Tournament quarterfinals and earned an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament defeating the Big Ten's Northwestern, 57-55, before bowing out to Baylor, 73-44.

LAST TIME ARKANSAS

The No. 18 Rutgers women's basketball team defeated No. 25 Arkansas, 64-52, on Sunday, Dec. 7 at Bud Walton Arena.

Kahleah Copper led all scorers with 17 points, while Betnijah Laney captured her eight straight double-double with 12 points and 11 rebounds. Playing in front of family and friends, Little Rock, Arkansas native, Tyler Scaife, had 13 points. Rachel Hollivay rounded out the Scarlet Knight double figure scorers with 13.

Arkansas' Jessica Jackson led her team with 14 points. She started off hot with 11 points going 5-of-6 from the floor to open the game, but was unable to convert a field goal over the final 11:21 of the first half and managed just three second-half points. Jhasmin Bowen contributed 13 in the

loss, while Melissa Wolff and Kelsey Brooks each had 11.

After a Jackson three-pointer put the Razorbacks up, 9-8, five minutes into the contest, Rutgers outscored Arkansas 5-1 over the next three minutes to control the lead the rest of the game. The Razorbacks were able to pull within two at 18-16 with 8:50 remaining in the half off of two Bowen free throws. The Scarlet Knights would close out the stanza outscoring Arkansas 16-8. Rutgers led 36-24 at the half.

The Scarlet Knights pushed their lead to as many as 14 in the early moments of the second half, but the Razorbacks would cut it to single digits by the midway point. During a span of seven minutes, Arkansas outscored Rutgers 12-4 as Brooks capped the run scoring on a layup with 11:39 remaining, cutting Rutgers' edge to 47-43. RU responded with a scoring burst of its own going on a 15-5 run over the following five minutes. Copper connected on two free throws to give Rutgers its biggest lead, 58-42, with 6:29 left. RU would maintain a double digit advantage to close the contest with a final score of 64-52.

JAMMING IN PARADISE

Rutgers won its third Paradise Jam Tournament title over Thanksgiving weekend in St. Thomas, going 3-0 at the tournament with wins over Tulane (75-51), Virginia (60-48) and Green Bay (54-43).

All three RU opponents reached the postseason a year ago, with Green Bay earning an automatic bid with the Horizon League Championship title, Tulane earning an at-large NCAA bid and Virginia going to the first round of the WNIT.

Kahleah Copper was named the Paradise Jam MVP after averaging 23.0 points, 7.7 rebounds and shooting 27-of-43 (.623) from the floor. She is the third Scarlet Knight Paradise Jam MVP joining Brittany Ray (2009) and Michelle Campbell

(2004) as the tournament's top players over the year.

Tyler Scaife was also an All-Tournament honoree after pouring in 11.3 points, 3.3 assists and going a perfect 8-of-8 from the line.

The Scarlet Knights, who were making their fourth appearance in the Paradise Jam Tournament, are 9-1 in the tournament.

PASSING THE TORCH

Last season Betnijah Laney was Rutgers' double-double machine posting 20 double-digit scoring and rebounding games.

This season, returning leading scorer Kahleah Copper has picked up right where Laney left off. Through the first eight games of the 2015-16 season, Copper has collected two doubledoubles.

The senior Scarlet Knight poured in a careerhigh 30 points and hauled in 10 rebounds in the season opener at St. Joseph's on Nov. 13 and followed with a 13-point, 11-rebound effort against Temple on Nov. 22. Both of her double-double efforts have come against schools from her hometown of Philadelphia.

With her 30 points against the Hawks, Copper surpassed her previous career bench mark of 27 points set in the third round WNIT game against Seton Hall in 2014.

To date, Copper has registered seven double figure scoring and rebounding contests.

Copper double figure scoring streak came to an end on Thursday night in the Big Ten/ACC Challenge with just nine points in the loss to Florid State. She entered the game with the Seminoles having scored in double figures in her last 18 contests dating back to last season. She has reached double figures in the prior seven contests leading up to Thursday night's game and last 11 games of the 2014-15 season.

MOVING ON UP

While leading scorer Kahleah Copper was held to only nine points in Thursday night's loss to Florida State, the senior Scarlet Knight did manage to move up two more spots on the all-time scoring leaders list. Copper moved past Liz Hanson (1992-95) and Kathy Glutz (1976-80) into 12th on the list.

Copper currently has 1,420 career points and needs 37 more points to surpass Tasha Pointer (1997-01) for 11th all-time and 81 more points to crack the Scarlet Knight top 10.

FROM THE LINE

Junior Tyler Scaife has been clutch from the line missing just one free throw in her 25 attempts to date.

Scaife opened the season going a perfect 13-of-13 from the charity stripe in the season's first three contests, which included a perfect 9-of-9 performance against St. John's on Nov. 19.

Believe it or not, Scaife's free throw performance against the Red Storm was not her career best. Scaife knocked down all 10 of her free throw attempts against Delaware in the first round of the WNIT back in 2014.

At the Paradise Jam last weekend, Scaife knocked down a perfect 8-of-8 from the line including a 6-of-6 mark in RU's victory over Green Bay to capture the 2015 Paradise Jam title.

PUTTING IN THE POINTS

A pair of Scarlet Knights reached new benchmarks in points scored in the 60-48 victory over Virginia at the Paradise Jam.

Shrita Parker reached double figures for the first time in her career with 11 points against the Cavaliers. She surpassed her previous high of nine points netted against Michigan at home last season and more recently, against Temple on Nov. 22. Parker finished the game 4-of-5 from the field, including going 2-of-2 from downtown.

Ariel Butts also set a new career-high with 10 points against the Cavaliers. Butts went a perfect 5-of-5 from the floor. She resets her former high of eight recorded vs. Temple on Feb. 26, 2014. Her field goals made are also a new high.

ON THE GLASS

Senior Ariel Butts returned to the court to make her 2015-16 debut on Nov. 19 against St. John's to set a new career mark in rebounds.

Butts hauled in 11 boards, including nine on the defense glass, to reset her previous benchmark of 10 set against Iowa last season in the Big Ten home opener.

Butts had missed the first two games of the season after a subluxation of the knee in the preseason made her a game day decision. Through seven games, she is averaging 6.3 rebounds per contest. She entered her senior season with a career average of 2.7 on the glass.

HELPING HAND

Redshirt senior guard Briyona Canty registered four games with five or more assists this season and is currently averaging 3.9 assists per game.

The Scarlet Knights' top play makers has recorded 25 games in her career handing out the ball five or more times, including 15 of her 29 games last year.

She captured a season-high seven helpers in RU's 61-51 win over Temple on Nov. 22, which kicked off the Scarlet Knights' four-game win streak.

Last season, had two double figure assist games in RU's 63-52 second round Big Ten Tournament win over Indiana as well as RU's victory over Northeastern on Nov. 18, 2013. Canty's double dishing effort marked the first double-digit assist game for a Scarlet Knight since Syessence Davis dished out the ball 10 times against Providence on Jan. 16, 2013.

In addition to her 10 assists in the opening Big Ten Tournament game with Indiana, she also handed the ball out six times in the quarterfinal against Northwestern to average 8.0 assists during Big Ten post-season play.

LOOKING AT THE THREE

The members of the Scarlet Knights took working on three-pointers seriously over the summer, which resulted in RU knocking down eight shots from downtown in the season opener at St. Joseph's on Nov. 13.

Six different Scarlet Knights have connected from beyond the arc led by Kahleah Copper and Tyler Scaife with eight 3-point field goals made each, followed by Shrita Parker and Cynthia Hernandez with six apiece.

RU has hit at least one three-point field goal in each of its eight games to date and is averaging 4.3 three point field goals a game. Last season, the Scarlet Knights went without a made shot from downtown in four contests and connected on only one three-pointer in nine games.

Last season, RU ranked last in the Big Ten and was 348 of 343 Division I schools in three-point field goals per game. In 2014-14, RU was 75-of-237 from three-point range and shot at a .316 clip from beyond the arc.

Rutgers kicked off this season going 8-of-12 from downtown for .644 percentage from threepoint range against St. Joseph's.

The Scarlet Knights had a 6-of-12 (.500) afternoon from three-point range against Temple with five different Scarlet Knights connecting from long range and connected on 3-of-4 (.750) with Virginia.

KAHLEAH COPPER

BIG TEN CO -PLAYER OF THE WEEK - WEEK ENDING NOV. 15: Copper opened the 2015-16 season with a double-double including a career-high 30 points to go along with 10 rebounds in RU's 78-65 victory at St. Joseph's to earn Big Ten Co-Player of the Week accolades. Copper collected her sixth career double-double and surpassed her previous career high of 27 points recorded in a double overtime victory over Seton Hall in the 2014 WNIT Championship run. The senior shot a blistering 10-of-14 (.714) percent from the floor, including a perfect 3-of-3 mark from long range. Additionally, she added four steals and two assists in the win. Copper's 30 points effort also gave her 1,301 career points becoming the 18th Scarlet Knight with 1,300 career points or more. The award marked the first Big Ten Conference weekly honor for Copper.

PARADISE JAM MVP/BIG TEN HONOR ROLL - WEEK ENDING NOV. 29: Copper was named the Paradise Jam Tournament MVP and earned a spot on the Big Ten Honor Roll after averaging 23.0 points, 7.7 rebounds and shot .628 from the field to steer Rutgers to the Paradise Jam Tournament title. The Scarlet Knights picked up wins on three consecutive days, downing Tulane, Virginia and Green Bay, all of which reached the post season last season. The senior forward led RU in scoring in all three games including 28 points against Tulane, 21 points vs. Virginia and 20 against Green Bay. She also hauled in eight boards in the contests with the Cavaliers and Green Bay. Copper moved past former teammate Betnijah Laney on the RU all-time scoring leaders list and became the 14th Scarlet Knight with over 1,400 career points. She currently has scored 1,411 points in her four seasons.

TYLER SCAIFE

PARADISE JAM ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM: Scaife averaged 11.3 points, 3.3 assists and shot a perfect 8-of-8 from the line as Rutgers won the Paradise Jam Tournament with wins over Tulane, Virginia and Green Bay .

PROTECTING HOMECOURT

The Scarlet Knights have had an outstanding track record of success at home. The Scarlet Knights went 11-4 at home in 2014-15, with all four setbacks against the nation's top 25.

Since the 2002-03 season, the Scarlet Knights have gone 162-30 (.844) at the RAC. In this last five years, RU has put together a record of 65-14 (.823) at the RAC.

RETURNING KNIGHTS

The Scarlet Knights welcomed back eight letterwinners and three starters from a season ago including Preseason All-Big Ten honoree, senior forward Kahleah Copper, and 2015 Big Ten Honorable Mention selection, junior guard Tyler Scaife.

Copper led the team for a second straight season and poured in 16.3 points per game as a junior last season. Scaife is RU's other returning double figure scorer with 14.8 points per game during the 2014-15 campaign.

NEW FACES

Along with four true freshman on the roster, all who made their Scarlet Knight debut from off the bench at St. Joseph's, Rutgers also welcomes three new assistant coaches to the bench.

Patrolling the sidelines with hall of fame head coach C. Vivian Stringer are Timothy Eatman, Kelley Gibson and Ervin Monier. Eatman, who has previously coached alongside Stringer at Iowa, joins the Scarlet Knights from Rhode Island. Gibson comes "To The Banks" from Syracuse while Ervin Monier joins the program from La Salle.

BACK TO THE BIG DANCE

The Rutgers women's basketball team returned to the NCAA Tournament advancing to the second round of tournament action last season. RU, made its 24th overall NCAA Tournament appearance and first since the 2012 campaign, was an at-large selection, receiving a No. 8 seed.

Rutgers captured a 79-66 victory over in-state and former BIG EAST rival Seton Hall in first round action before its dancing was halted in the second round by the tournament's top overall seed and eventual national champions, Connecticut.

WELCOME TO THE BIG TIME

Rutgers began its first season of Big Ten play in 2014-15 as the Scarlet Knights finished with a 12-6 ledger and tied for fourth in the league.

Head coach C. Vivian Stringer was no stranger to the Big Ten and in fact became the league's winningest women's basketball coach. A 46-43 Scarlet Knight victory over Nebraska on Feb. 5, 2015 gave the hall of fame coach her 177th Big Ten victory.

Stringer was at the helm of the Iowa Hawkeye program from 1983-95, winning 169 games with the Hawkeyes, while compiling 12 wins in RU's first season in the conference.

C. VIVIAN STRINGER

Head Coach • 21st Season at Rutgers, 45th Season Overall

One of the most recognizable names and faces in all of college basketball, C. Vivian Stringer has built an illustrious career highlighted by countless milestones, and now guides the Scarlet Knights into it's newest era as a member of the Big Ten Conference.

In 44 seasons on the sidelines, Stringer has been the primary architect in transforming three programs into national title contenders ever since her appearance in the first-ever NCAA National Championship game. She has guided teams to 26 of the 35 NCAA

Tournaments, including 10-straight from 2003 to 2012, and won the WNIT title in her first and only appearance in the post-season tournament in 2014. The first coach in men's or women's basketball history to take three different schools to the Final Four (Cheyney in 1982, Iowa in 1993 and Rutgers, in 2000 and again in 2007), Stringer has been a pioneer, visionary and leader during her four decades of success on the hardwood.

Entering the 2015-16 season, Stringer has compiled a remarkable overall record of 952-351 (.731), which ranks fourth on the all-time Division I women's coaches victories list and third among active coaches. Only former Tennessee head coach Pat Summitt, North Carolina's Sylvia Hatchell and Stanford's Tara VanDerveer have compiled more career wins than Stringer in women's basketball coaching ranks.

In Feb. 2013, Stringer became just the seventh coach - men's or women's to reach the 900-win mark and more recently in Feb. 2015, she became the all-time winningest Big Ten women's basketball coach with 182 conference wins during her tenure at Iowa and Rutgers. Additionally, her 34 20-win seasons are second-best in women's basketball history.

In her 20 seasons "On The Banks", Stringer has registered a 432-216 mark, having led the Scarlet Knights to 15 NCAA Tournament appearances, as well as the WNIT Championship in 2014. Entering the 2015-16 season, Stringer needs only three more victories to surpass fellow Women's Basketball Hall of Famer, Theresa Grentz, as RU's all-time winningest basketball coach.

Further solidifying her name among the elite in the game, Stringer was enshrined into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in arguably the best Hall of Fame class ever on Sept. 11, 2009. She joined fellow esteemed basketball greats Michael Jordan, David Robinson, John Stockton and Jerry Sloan on the stage at Symphony Hall to receive basketball's ultimate honor. She became just the 11th women's coach to earn the prestigious prize.

A 2001 inductee into the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame, Stringer has led her three teams to 25 appearances in the NCAA Tournament, including nine trips to the regional final. She also made her sixth appearance on a USA Basketball coaching staff in 2004, serving as an assistant coach for the gold-medal winning 2004 U.S. Olympic Team. Named one of the "101 Most Influential Minorities in Sports" by Sports Illustrated in 2003, Stringer continues to be one of the most recognized coaches in the game.

A coal miner's daughter, Stringer learned a valuable lesson from her parents growing up in the small tight-knit community of Edenborn in western Pennsylvania: "Work hard and don't look for excuses, and you can achieve anything."

That lesson has stuck with the legendary college basketball coach and has been one of the primary messages she has passed on to the hundreds of players who have stood before her. It's been her perseverance and strength in the eyes of adversity that has meant the most to the people around her. Stringer prides herself on not only teaching her players the game of basketball but more importantly providing them life lessons that stand the test of time.

Stringer has overcome many challenges in her life; the loss of her beloved father at the tender age of 19; in 1982, her only daughter being stricken with spinal meningitis just prior to her Cheyney team's appearance in the very first Final Four; the sudden death of her beloved husband, Bill, to a heart attack on Thanksgiving Day 1992 and a bout with breast cancer which she kept a secret from nearly everyone in her life.

Through it all, Stringer has handled life with dignity and grace rising above the tragedies to make a difference in the lives of hundreds of young women.

THE ROAD TO RUTGERS

Stringer began her teaching and coaching career at Cheyney, a small, historically-black school outside of Philadelphia, Pa., in the early 1970s. Even before the seeds of Title IX had truly started to take root nationally, Stringer and her Wolves were playing to packed houses and creating a name for themselves on the East Coast.

In 1982, the NCAA sponsored its first-ever National Championship for women's basketball, and Cheyney did the unthinkable by advancing to that first Final Four, losing to Louisiana Tech in the championship game. For Stringer and her players (not much older than herself), Cheyney's postseason run put the small university on the national map, as well as on par with the national powerhouse programs.

Following 12 successful and fulfilling seasons at Cheyney, Stringer sought out a new challenge and found that opportunity at the University of Iowa. Beginning with the 1983-84 season, Stringer built a program that helped elevate women's basketball to a whole new level. When Stringer got to Iowa, the Hawkeyes had won just seven games the season before her arrival and were ranked 299 out of 302 teams nationally in attendance. Stringer helped the team achieve unprecedented amounts of attention, including women's basketball's first-ever advance sellout at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Stringer's hard work and dedication culminated in Iowa's trip to the 1993 Final Four, a feat that made her the first coach in history to lead two different schools to the national semifinals.

WE ARE A FAMILY

It is not just about the success on the floor for the Scarlet Knights. Stringer's programs have always had the feel of a family, but that family extends well beyond the confines of the RAC.

Community involvement has been an important part of extending that family, whether it be conducting free basketball clinics for local children, visiting with the young and old at local hospitals and centers, emphasizing the importance of education or lending support to Rutgersbased charities and events. The Scarlet Knights have become more than students and athletes during their careers – they have become citizens and role models as well.

That public visibility and involvement has, in turn, caused the community to embrace the Scarlet Knights and lend them support at the RAC. RU recorded its largest crowd in history to see a women's home game when 8,587 fans witnessed the Scarlet Knights' victory against the nation's number-one team, Notre Dame, on Feb. 17, 2001, one of seven advance sellouts for RU since Stringer's arrival.

ACCOLADES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

Stringer was at a loss for words before she was to give her Naismith enshrinement speech on Sept. 11. After all, her career extended over four decades of work and involved countless players and coaches who touched her life. Overcome with emotion and fighting back tears, Stringer delivered one of the most eloquent speeches, sharing with the crowd and a national audience on ESPN how her desire to coach was fueled early in her life.

In addition to Naismith, Stringer is also a member of the Women's Basketball Hall of Fame. Enshrined on June 9, 2001, in Knoxville, Tenn., the honor truly showed Stringer's mark on the game in regards to equality, innovation and growth.

Stringer has been named the National Coach of the Year three times (Wade Trophy — 1982, Converse — 1988 and Naismith — 1993) by her peers. She also was named the 1993 Coach of the Year by Sports Illustrated, USA Today, Converse, the Los Angeles Times and the Black Coaches Association.

In addition, she was tabbed the 2000 Female Coach of the Year by the Rainbow/PUSH Organization, a group founded by Rev. Jesse Jackson; the District V Coach of the Year in 1985, 1988 and 1993; the District I Coach of the Year in 1998 and 2006; the Big Ten Coach of the Year in 1991 and 1993; the BIG EAST Coach of the Year in 1998 and 2005; and a six-time Metropolitan Basketball Writers Association Coach of the Year(1998-00, 2005-06 and 2008).




