- The Jackrabbits, 1-0, beat a talented Marist College team, 77-68, Nov. 13 in their opener. All-league candidate Macy Miller led five players in double digits in scoring with a game-high 19 points. She also added six rebounds, four assists and a steal.
- Arkansas, 2-0, won both its home games last week. The Razorbacks defeated Southeastern, 97-53, and Sam Houston State, 67-47.
- SDSU leads the all-time series, 1-0. The Jackrabbits won the first meeting, 80-75 in overtime in Fayetteville, Ark., Dec. 4, 2014.

- Noteworthy
- The Jackrabbits are protecting an 11-game home winning streak, 21st-longest in the NCAA. The last time the Jacks lost in Frost Arena was Dec. 10, 2014, to Green Bay, 77-75.
- The Jacks look to snap a trend Wednesday. The last time they won back-to-back games to open a season was 2011-12 when they defeated St. Cloud State and Utah State enroute to a 24-9 season.

Jackrabbits Upset No. 25 Arkansas

- FAYETTEVILLE, Ark.—Chynna Stevens' game-tying 3-pointer with 0.4 in regulation capped a 15-6 run and helped South Dakota State upset No. 25 Arkansas, 80-75 in overtime, in front of 1,038 fans at Bud Walton Arena.
- Trailing 62-53 with 21 seconds left, the Jackrabbits' comeback started with Macy Miller converting a traditional 3-point play and Mariah Clarin stealing the Arkansas inbounds pass and scoring on a layup with 17 seconds left.
- After a pair of Razorback free throws, Kerri Young sank a 3-pointer with 10 seconds to go. Arkansas missed both free throws with 8 seconds before Stevens hit the game-tying 3-pointer to send the game into overtime.
- Miller, who scored a career-high 20 points to lead the Jacks, scored 15 second-half points to lead the SDSU charge. The guard was 5 of 6 from the field and 6 for 6 from the free-throw line during the half.
- In overtime, the Jackrabbits outscored the previously unbeaten Razorbacks, 16-11, and shot 66.7 percent from the field and 78.6 percent from the foul line. Megan Waytashek

- The Jackrabbits last beat a ranked team in 2013-14 when they upset then-No. 11 Penn State, 83-79. SDSU's last road win over a ranked team was at then-No. 25 Minnesota in 2008, 65-55.

Jacks Win Season Opener

- South Dakota State used a 9-2 run to open the second half and record a 77-68 win over Marist College Nov. 13 in front of 1,624 fans at Frost Arena in its season and home
- The Jackrabbits had five players score in double figures in the nonconference game. Macy Miller had a team-high 19 points while Kerri Young added 12 points and a careerand game-high 11 rebounds. Madison Guebert scored 11 points in her collegiate debut. Ellie Thompson and Gabby Boever each scored 10 points.
- Marist had the lead for all but 26 seconds of the first quarter, eventually building a 14-8 lead after a basket by Kendall Baab with 2:33 to play in the guarter.
- South Dakota State scored the next six points to tie the game, 14-14, when Thompson made the second of two foul shots with 8:59 remaining in the second quarter. Boever gave the Jackrabbits a 22-21 lead with a 3-point field goal with 5:26 left in the half but the Red Foxes closed the half with a 14-7 run for a 35-31 lead. Coffey and Allie Clement each scored six points during that run.
- Miller sank a 3-pointer 91 seconds into the second half to give State a 40-37 lead and the Jackrabbits never trailed. Miller scored 10 points and Young added 8 in the third guarter as SDSU built a 59-50 lead.
- The Jackrabbits' lead grew to 15, 69-54, with 6:41 left when Thompson made a foul shot.

Home Win Streak

- SDSU is sporting an 11-game home win streak entering Wednesday's game. The Jacks won their final 10 games in Frost Arena last season and their season and home opener vs. Marist. The streak ranks 21st in the NCAA.
- South Carolina has the longest home win streak at 36 games followed by UConn (35), Florida Gulf Coast (28), Maryland (24), Tennessee (23) and Iowa (20). Seventeen other NCAA teams have at least a 10-game winning streak.
- The last time SDSU lost in Frost was Dec. 10, 2014. to Green Bay, 77-75.
- The Jacks' home win streak also ranks sixth alltime at SDSU.

■ In his 16th season as head coach of the South Dakota State women's basketball team. Aaron Johnston has



taken the Jackrabbit program to the top of NCAA Division II and is leading SDSU to national prominence at the Division I level.

■ Johnston has a

career record of 366-126 (.743 winning percentage), ranking first on the SDSU career victories list. Johnston posted his 350th career victory March 10, 2015, against South Dakota. His career totals have included a 114-22 record (.838 winning percentage) in Summit League regular-season games, a 18-1 mark in Summit League postseason tournament contests and a 23-12 mark

(.657 winning percentage) in postseason games.

■ The Summit League Coach of the Year in each of the Jackrabbits' first two seasons in the league and again during the 2011-12 and 2013-14 seasons. Johnston was named a finalist for the 2009 Naismith Award as the nation's top coach. SDSU tied a school record for victories in a season with 32 during the 2008-09 campaign and gained national attention by vaulting into the top 25 in December after nonconference victories over the likes of Wisconsin, Utah, Minnesota and Gonzaga. The Jackrabbits were ranked in the final 13 USA Today/ESPN regular season coaches' polls, climbing as high as 14th in the coaches' poll and 16th in the Associated Press poll. SDSU finished the 2008-09 season ranked 19th in the coaches' poll.
