QUICK KICKS

>> The Razorback soccer team heads into the final stretch of the regular season as it will face Kentucky on Thursday at Razorback Field. Arkansas is unbeaten in five of their last six matches going back to Sept. 16 vs. Providence.

>> Arkansas is 5-2-0 against Kentucky under head coach Colby Hale with four wins coming in the last seven meetings. Overall, Kentucky still owns the all-time series 13-8-2 and has won four times at Razorback Field.

>> Arkansas is still unbeaten at home this year at 7-0-1, including a win over No. 2 Texas A&M. In its eight home games, the Razorbacks are averaging two goals a game and have four one-goal victories.

>> The Razorbacks still lead the league in corner kicks (108) and have the third-most in SEC play (37). Six of their 25 goals this year have come directly off corner kicks.

>> Last week, junior Tori Cannata turned in her second multi-goal performance of the season when she scored both goals in a 2-1 overtime victory over LSU on Thursday. Cannata is tied for the team lead with six goals on the year.

>> In conference play, Cannata is averaging a .727 shot on goal percentage and has two braces in her last five matches.

>> All four of Arkansas' conference victories have been by one goal this year. Overall, the Razorbacks are 5-1-0 in one-goal matches this season and two of those game-winning goals have come off the foot of Kayla McKeon.

>> McKeon has totaled a team-leading three game-winning goals this season, matching her total from her freshman season and giving her seven for her career, ranking her eighth all time in Razorback history.

>> With her assist in the 1-0 victory over Missouri, sophomore Taylor Malham leads the team with seven assists this year, which is also good for second in the SEC.

>> Malham is one of three Razorbacks to have 10 or more points this year. Junior Kayla McKeon leads the team with 14 points with six goals and two assists. Tori Cannata has 13 points with six goals and one assists after her two-goal outing against LSU last week.



Junior Tori Cannata has become one of the Razorbacks' major offensive threats in recent weeks. Last week, against LSU, Cannata secured her second brace of the season, including scoring her first game-winning goal of the year, in overtime to defeat the Tigers, 2-1. She joins Marissa Kinsey as the only two Razorbacks with multi-goal games this year.

RAZORBACK NOTES

Series Vs. Kentucky

>> Arkansas is 8-13-2 all-time against Kentucky, but has come out winners in four of its last six, including two at Razorback Field.

>> After Colby Hale was named head coach prior to the 2012 season, Arkansas won three-straight against the Wildcats, scoring two or more goals in all three matches.

>> In last year's matchup in Lexington, Arkansas tallied one of its school-record tying 10 shutouts in a 2-0 win. Goals from Jessi Hartzler and Abbie Neece provided the tally and both came off corner kicks from Parker Goins.

Scouting The Wildcats

>> After starting the season 3-0-0, Kentucky is now 4-11-0 and 0-6-0 in conference play. The 3-0-0 start was its first since 2012.

>> Led by head coach Ian Carry, the Wildcats are coming off a 4-1 loss to No. 6 Texas A&M and are on a seven-match losing streak.

>> Kentucky is led by sophomores Yuuka Kurosaki and Hollie Olding, who are tied for the team lead with four goals each. Kurosaki is out for the remainder of the season after suffering a leg injury against Florida (Sept. 20).

>> Defensively, goalkeeper Hannah Leonard has started 11-of-12 matches, scoring four wins and one shutout (vs. Furman), while making 42 saves in 1,026 minutes of play.

Cannata Grows Into Another Scoring Threat

>> After securing her second brace in four matches, junior Tori Cannata has become one of the strongest offensive threats for the Razorbacks at the end of the season.

>> Cannata is tied with Kayla McKeon for the team lead with six goals and second with 13 points, but four of her six scores have come in only two matches (vs. #2 Texas A&M; vs. LSU).

>> Both of those braces are the first of her career and she joins Marissa Kinsey as the only Razorbacks with two or more goals and four or more points in a match this season.

>> Before this season, Cannata only had two goals in her career and seven points. She's quadrupled her goal total and doubled her point total this season and both are top-six totals in the SEC.

No Mercy At Home

>> Arkansas' play at home this year has been, arguably, the best among the SEC this year. The Razorbacks are one of five teams in the league that are still unbeaten at home.

>> At 7-0-1, the Razorbacks are off to their second-best start at home under Colby Hale. The 2016 team still holds the school record for most home wins in a single season (10).

>> Even though the offense is averaging over two goals a game at Razorback Field, the defense is holding opponents to a 4.2 shots on goal average in matches played at home. That average is fifth best in the SEC.

To Be The Best, You Have To Beat The Best

>> With the result against West Virginia in Week 1 and win over No. 2 Texas A&M in Week 6, Arkansas has won or tied five out of its last eight matches (.625) against top 10 opponents going back to the 2016 season.

>> The five results are more than any other team in the SEC over that same span.

>> Of the five matches against top-10 opponents three have come at Razorback Field.

>> Before the tie against West Virginia, Arkansas' last result against a top-10 ranked opponent came against South Carolina in the SEC Tournament last year.

VanFossen Heading Up Defensive Front

>> After a perfect weekend in wins over Texas A&M and Alabama, sophomore Haley VanFossen secured the SEC Defensive Player of the Week award, Arkansas' fourth player of the week this year.

>> VanFossen was a key component in both matches as she played all 180 minutes as Arkansas' center back.

>> VanFossen helped limit the Aggies to only two shots on goal, neither coming in the run of play. The two shots on goal were the lowest total for Texas A&M in a match this season.

>> Against Alabama, the defense held the Tide to only one corner kick, marking the seventh time this year Arkansas has held its' opponent to two corner kicks or less.

RAZORBACK NOTES

>> Arkansas has had four players picked as players of the week this year, the most of any team in the SEC.

>> For VanFossen, the sophomore has played in all 14 matches, starting 13, and logging 1,163 minutes of play.

Razorbacks Knock Off No. 2 Texas A&M

>> With the help of a brace from junior Tori Cannata and a first career goal from freshman Bryana Hunter, the Razorbacks withstood an aggressive match from start to finish to beat No. 2 Texas A&M, 3-2.

>> It was the first win for Arkansas over Texas A&M since 1993 and snapped the Aggies 25-match overall unbeaten streak that dated back to Sept. 17, 2017.

>> Both of Cannata's goals were go-ahead goals and was the first brace of her career.

>> Hunter, who had not appeared in a match yet this year due to an injury, was logging her first career minutes off the bench and came through with a clutch goal in the 75th minute, one of two shots she had in 23 minutes of action.

>> Hunter is the ninth different Razorback with at least one goal this year.

Parker Goins Heats Up Play

>> After being held goalless in the first five matches of the season, sophomore Parker Goins found the back of the net twice against FAU and UConn.

>> Goins had the game-winner against the Owls, the fifth of her career. Then, scored on a penalty kick against the Huskies in the 86th minute.

>> Her play earned her the SEC Offensive Player of the Week award, as well as an honorable mention for the Top Drawer Soccer Team of the Week. It was her second SEC weekly award of her career.

>> Prior to the loss at Georgia, Goins had a streak of five-consecutive games with at least one point and an assist in four of the previous five matches.

McKeon A Quiet Offensive Threat

>> Even though her goal at Ole Miss last week wasn't enough to defeat the Rebels, Kayla McKeon continues to be the top forward on the team with a team-leading six goals and 14 points.

>> McKeon has totaled 959 minutes this year, the most of any attacking player on the team.

>> McKeon's five goals this year is one more than her

entire total from 2017 (4 goals; 23 games; 1,749 minutes played).

>> McKeon now has 19 goals in her career, including seven game winners, which are the most of any active Razorback. She also has 46 career points to go along with eight career assists.

Second Half, Best Half

>> This season, Arkansas is outscoring its opponents 18-8 in the second half, including 12 in the final 20 minutes.

>> In the last four seasons, Arkansas has outscored its opponents 82-50 in the second halves with 22 coming last year.

All About The Set Pieces

>> Going into Week 10 of the conference season, Arkansas is leading all league teams with 108 corner kicks.

>> Arkansas is one of the more dangerous teams in the nation when working off of set pieces as seven of its 25 goals have come from corner kicks.

>> The Razorbacks are also 2-for-3 on penalty kicks.

Kinsey's Brace Leads Hogs In Home Opener

>> Junior Marissa Kinsey scored a goal in each half of the Razorbacks' home opener against Omaha. The goals were her first of the season.

>> Kinsey was the first Razorback to secure the brace since Stefani Doyle did it at Providence last year (Sept. 10, 2017).

>> Both Kinsey and Tori Cannata have recorded multi-goal performances this season. Last year, Arkansas had five different players record two or more goals in a match.

Packing Them In

>> On Aug. 31, the Razorbacks had the third-largest crowd ever at Razorback Field, defeating Baylor in a 3-2 result.

>> The Razorback fans set a single-game attendance record as 3,401 fans watched the Razorbacks take on top-ranked Penn State last year.

>> Last year 13,538 fans entered Razorback Field over 10 home games, good for an average of 1,354. That average

Hoke Earns Season's First SEC Defender of the Week Award

>> Senior defender Carly Hoke was tabbed as the SEC Defender of the Week in Week 1 by the league office for her performance in Arkansas' season-opening win over Duquesne and tie against No. 9 West Virginia. It's the first conference weekly honor in Hoke's career.

>> Coming off a season-ending knee injury a year ago, Hoke was able to make her comeback against Duquesne and West Virginia, playing all 200 possible minutes.

>> Hoke's 67 starts are the second-most of any active Razorback and she has contributed to 17 clean sheets since 2015.

Protect Your Turf

>> Since 2016, Arkansas is 21-5 in matches played at Razorback Field, including wins this season over Omaha, Baylor, Florida Atlantic, UConn, No. 2 Texas A&M and Missouri.

>> Since Colby Hale was named the head coach in 2012, Arkansas has won 44 of its last 64 home games, including at least five wins per year.

Goins Looking To Continue Upward Trend In Year Two

>> Sophomore Parker Goins had one of the best freshman seasons in program history, leading the team with nine goals and 25 points, both of which were top-five totals in the SEC.

>> Last season, Goins first collegiate goal was one of four she scored against Abilene Christian, becoming the first Razorback to score four times in a match since 2001.

>> Goins went on to be named to the All-SEC Second Team and SEC All-Freshman Team and was ranked as the No. 30 freshman in the country by TopDrawerSoccer.com at year's end.

New Look Coaching Staff

>> Head coach Colby Hale added two new faces to his coaching staff for the 2018 season, bringing in former East Carolina head coach Rob Donnenwirth and former Notre Dame standout Sammy Scofield.

>> Donnenwirth spent 19 years at ECU as is the winningest coach in Pirate history, compiling a 177-150-44 record.

>> Donnenwirth produced nine 10-win seasons at ECU and one conference championship. He also mentored 86 all-conference players and will work with the goalkeepers at Arkansas.

>> Scofield, a 2015 graduate of Notre Dame, spent the last two seasons as an assistant coach at Elon University.

>> While at Notre Dame, Scofield started in 79 of her 88

matches and was named the team's Most Valuable Freshman in 2011 and team captain in 2014.

>> While at Elon, Scofield helped guide the Phoenix to matching a program record with five players taking home postseason honors in 2017.

DE-FENSE.....DE-FENSE

>> As good as the offense was in 2017, Arkansas' defense helped it earn all 13 of its conference points by locking up five shutouts.

>> Combined, the Arkansas defense notched a school-record tying 10 shutouts en route to its second-straight SEC Tournament final appearance and fourth NCAA Tournament appearance in program history.

>> In nine of those shutouts, the Razorback defense has held opponents to 17 shots or less and a .338 shot on goal percentage.

Malham's Goal Leads Hogs In First Exhibition

>> Sophomore Taylor Malham was the first Razorback to find the back of the net in the 2018 season when her one-timer score led the Razorbacks to a 1-0 victory over Kansas State in exhibition play.

>> Malham comes off a stellar freshman campaign where she scored six goals, good for second on the team, and also tallied two assists.

>> Arkansas was able to utilize its full roster throughout the match as 21 different players made it onto the field for at least 16 or more minutes.

>> Sophomore Brooke Pirkle led all players, going a full 90 minutes in the midfield.

Goal Outburst Pushes Hogs Past Nebraska

>> Arkansas finished off its exhibition schedule with a 3-1 win over Nebraska.

>> Sophomores Taylor Malham, Abbi Neece, and junior Tori Cannata all provided scores in the two-goal victory.

>> Seven players recorded 60 or more minutes in the match with midfielders Carly Hoke playing a full 90 minutes.

Four Razorbacks Named To SEC Players to Watch List

>> Junior Stefani Doyle led a group of four Razorbacks that were named to the SEC's Preseason Watch List earlier this week.

>> Along with Doyle, sophomores Parker Goins, Taylor Malham and Haley VanFossen were named to the watch list after stellar freshman seasons. This is the second-straight year on the list for Doyle.

>> Doyle started all 24 matches last year, while finishing third on the team in goals (5), tying for second in assists (6) and second in points (16). She scored one of two Razorback goals against top-ranked Penn State and scored her first NCAA Tournament goal against NC State in Arkansas' first-round match last year.

>> Goins was named to the All-SEC Second Team and Freshman Team after leading the team with nine goals and 25 points.

>> VanFossen was another of the number of freshman to contribute heavily in 2017. Last year, the Tulsa, Oklahoma-native started in 23 matches, logging 1,878 minutes, the fifth-most on the team. She also scored once, coming against Providence and notched three assists, one coming in the SEC Tournament.

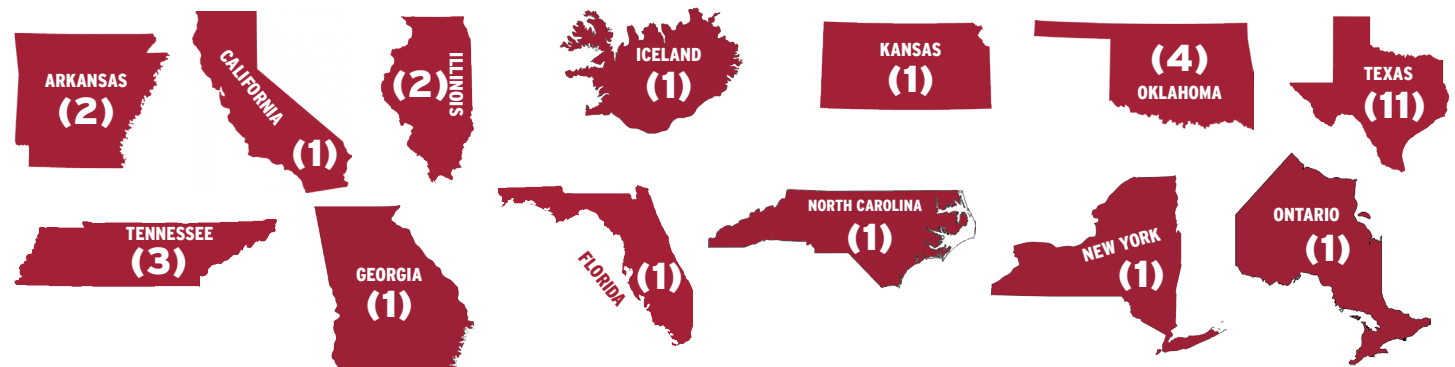

Colby Hale enters his seventh season as head soccer coach at the University of Arkansas after being named to the position on Dec. 21, 2011.

Since Hale took over the program, the Razorbacks have reached the NCAA Tournament four times, the only times the program has ever reached the postseason. He's also overseen five all-region players, nine all-conference selections, one Academic All-American, one scholar All-American, and 86 Fall SEC Academic Honor Roll selections.

Hale's teams have shown a postseason prowess also, as the Razorbacks have been a force in November, especially over the last two seasons. Including reaching the SEC Tournament in five of the last six seasons, Arkansas has reached the SEC Tournament final twice under Hale, both in 2016 and 2017.

The 2017 tournament run might have been the most improbable as the Razorbacks entered the conference tournament as the eight seed, but rolled off wins over nine-seed Ole Miss (1-0), one-seed South Carolina (1-0), and four-seed Vanderbilt (1-1, 4-2 on PK's) before bowing out against two-seed Texas A&M (2-1).

Arkansas became the lowest-seeded team to ever reach the tournament final and the run helped secure the school's ninth 10-win season and fourth NCAA Tournament appearance.

Attendance at Razorback Field has also seen an uptick since Hale's arrival and each year, the numbers continue to rise. Last year, Arkansas finished 10th in the nation in total attendance (13,538), fourth-best in the SEC and 10th in average attendance (1,354).

In last year's home opener against top-ranked Penn State, the Razorbacks set a single-game attendance record for 3,401, the fifth-straight season the single-game attendance record has been broken.

After a historic 18-5-1 season marked by several program milestones, Hale and Razorback Soccer concluded its 2016 season ranked No. 19 on the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) top 25 poll after peaking at No. 11 following a school-record eight-straight wins from Sept. 9, 2016 to Oct. 9, 2016.

Hale guided the team to their first win against a top-10 opponent against then-No.2-ranked Duke on Aug. 26 in front of a record-breaking crowd at Razorback Field. Arkansas would also upset then-No. 4-ranked Florida 2-1 on Sept. 16 at home for the program's first victory against the Gators.

These two wins against top-five programs and other quality opponents would catapult Arkansas to its highest NCAA RPI ranking in school history, topping out at No. 9 on Sept. 28.

Hale would also gain the unique honor of being Arkansas' winningest soccer coach after earning his 46th career win as a Razorback following a 1-0 victory over North Texas on Sept. 11. He would later lead the team to its fourth SEC Tournament, and following wins against Vanderbilt and Auburn in the quarterfinals and semifinals, Arkansas competed in its first SEC Tournament championship match since 1996. The Razorbacks also earned their third NCAA Tournament bid in four years and hosted the program's first NCAA Tournament match at home in school history.

Soccer completed the 2015 season at 6-11-1. Season highlights included a 2-2 tie in double-overtime against No. 10 South Carolina on Oct. 2, the program's first result against a top-10 program since 2007; the selection of hybrid defender/midfielder Carly Hoke as the 2015 SEC Freshman of the Year; and senior defender Teni Butler being named by the Razorback Foundation as a Red Tie Co-Female Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Home attendance was also strong for a second consecutive year, with the all-time attendance mark at Razorback Field topped on Aug. 23 against TCU.

Hale and the Razorbacks finished the 2014 season with a 9-7-6 overall mark, giving the program its first back-to-back winning season since the 2008 and 2009 seasons. Arkansas was also the No. 9 seed in the conference tournament and earned the program's second consecutive bid to the NCAA Tournament (second in school history). After picking up a 3-2 overtime victory at Oklahoma in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament, the Razorbacks fell at No. 3 Stanford, 1-0, in the Round of 32 to end the season.

In just his second season at the helm, Hale posted the most successful season in Razorback soccer history at 15-8-1, leading his team to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in the program's 28 year history. In the team's tournament debut, Hale guided the Razorbacks past Oklahoma State and St. John's to the final round of 16.

Hale had a plan to take the program to the next level and set the bar high in his first season at Arkansas. In the 2012 preseason, he talked about the team's "identity" and "blue collar mentality," and how the Razorbacks would be dependent on a team concept and not the play of two or three stars. Hale and the Razorbacks saw the results of that blue collar mentality and hard work pay off with a dramatic turnaround.

The Razorbacks were 4-14-0 and 2-9-0 in the Southeastern Conference the year before Hale arrived on campus (2011). In 2012, with a senior class of just two - Andrea Carlson and Allie Chandler - Hale led the Razorbacks to a 9-10-1 overall record and 6-6-1 finish in the SEC.

That step led to a 4.5 game improvement from 2011, including four more wins in conference play.

Hale became just the third of eight Arkansas soccer head coaches to win his first game as coach, topping Austin Peay 2-1 at home on Aug. 17 2012. Two days later, the Razorbacks followed up with their first big win of the season by beating Texas 1-0 for the first time in program history in Fayetteville.

Prior to landing the top spot at Arkansas, Hale, one of the nation's fastest rising assistant coaches, helped guide multiple programs to success on the field and in the classroom. He moved to Arkansas after spending the previous nine seasons at the University of Central Florida (UCF), helping the Knights to 130 wins (130-50-22) with six conference championships (four Conference USA, two Atlantic Sun), seven NCAA Tournament bids and eight wins in the postseason. In seven years at Conference USA, UCF was 56-11-9 with four league titles.

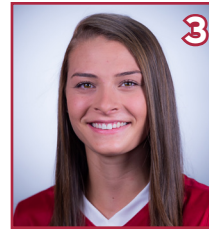
